Golden Trowel Nominations Now Due Nov. 30



In addition to making grants to Rotary Clubs to assist them in their projects, an important activity of the Rotary District 6360 Foundation is presenting the Golden Trowel Award. This award came into being shortly after the Rotary District 6360

Foundation was founded, nearly thirty years ago. It is presented to Non-Rotarians that significantly impact the success of a club's project or event. It is a way of saying "THANKS" to members of our community who ... Give Service Above Self ... in support of a club's activities.

Rotary District 6360 Foundation (RD6360F) annually awards up to four Golden Trowel Awards. The form for making the nomination can be found HERE. Cereal City Rotarian World Record Holder

When Charles Solano, a member of the Cereal City Sunrise Rotary Club in Battle Creek, Michigan, failed at his attempt to set a new 24-hour world record for chin-ups, he didn't give up!



►ew people can do several hundred chin-ups in a 12-hour day. And even fewer people can do several thousand. But only one person in the world, Charles Solano, can do 5,107!

As the spring rains fell on Battle Creek, Friday, May 3, many friends and fellow Rotarians, along with wife, Jessica, and daughter, Kaia—and two official

witnesses—assembled at one of Solano's five coffee shops to see Solano brake the old record of 3,751 chin-ups in eight hours, with a total of 3800, and beat the 12-hour record of 4,649, with an amazing 5,107 chin-ups. Read more <u>HERE</u>!

club.

With school starting the following week, Lucie attended the August 2^{ft} meeting of the Eaton Rapids Rotary. School will prevent her from attending most Wednesday morning meetings, but Lisa expects Lucie to be involved with Rotary service projects and social events as her school schedule allows.

"Belgium is a small, but busy country, where even rural areas are close to large cities. So, coming to a small, midwestern town will be a big change. But it's a change I am looking forward to. I think that people are people wherever we live in the world, so even though we come from different surroundings, we're more alike than we might realize," said Lucie.

District Youth Services Chair Margie Haas was on hand to help welcome Lucie to Michigan. Margie announced that all four foreign students who had been allocated to District 6360 Clubs had been placed. She also encouraged Clubs to begin recruiting "outbound" students to travel from the Midwest to other countries for the 2025-26


Marshall Rotary Club Welcomes The ARC

During a recent visit to the Jackson Breakfast Rotary, I learned about President Al Mellinger's non-profit foundation which operates "Marketplace Manna," a shop that sells fair trade merchandise that helps the homeless and low-income residents in the Jackson area.

Al currently works with more than thirty organizations that serve in fifty countries on five continents. Marketplace Manna also operates a retail store and online (marketplacemannna.com) shop. This is where he sells the handmade items for the

partner organizations.

A major focus of Al's time is working with the homeless and low-income elderly in Jackson by providing some supplemental income by hiring them a few hours a month to create items that are then sold in the retail locations. "The real value is getting to know the people and letting them know they still matter and can still make a difference" states AI "We want to communicate hope the people we serve, that better days are ahead" AI continued.

Al and his wife Diane travel around the Midwest (and beyond) setting up a display of products for sale and sharing how groups can make a difference where they live. There are poor folks who need to know they matter to someone. Al is open to coming and sharing the work they if any group or club is interested.


