We're a busy Club, and here's how we were making an impact this month.

Community Service Committee

The Community Service Committee is currently developing plans for the following upcoming events: October Fall Clean up, October November Blood Drive, November Coat Drive, November RSVP Rotary Salutes Veterans Program and December Gift Mart. New members and volunteers are always needed.

International Service Committee

The International Service committee projects include: refugee assistance for a family fleeing gang attacks in Honduras, a fundraiser planning for school improvements in Uganda, completion of follow up reports on several schools in Honduras and a clinic in India, a medical project in Mexico and assistance with a blood donation center in a district grant in Nigeria. Two additional grants for educational equipment in Honduras are in draft state. A district grant to support mechanical equipment in a Chicago refugee education center is in development. A sustainable agriculture project in Haiti is under study and the NGO made a presentation to the committee about needed supplies and farm animals.

Several members of our Club went to Rotary Madison on August 28 to talk about potential collaboration opportunities, particularly around Global grants. Club members might recognize the guy in the middle - Charles McLimans! He's Madison's Past President and used to be part of our Naperville Club. He was the Executive Director for Loaves and Fishes.


What Our Club is Up To
