## Together we are People of Action Making the Magic of Rotary Happen!



#### Youth Mental Health First Aid for Adults Course February 1

The District will host training for Youth Mental Health First Aid for Adults, conducted by Kids Matter. The 6-hour course will provide a 3year certification from the National Council for Behavioral Health. It will teach individuals how to identify, understand, support and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders in youth. The training will be offered for up to 50 District 6450 members on February 1. Registration will open December 1. The costs will be covered by a Rotary Foundation District Grant. Once we have a cadre of adults trained, we will shift our focus to our youth programs, particularly Interact.
