Bill Nance reported the news of the day, Rotary news, and the weather. Cathy Ponitz was invited to the podium to introduce visitors and guests. Judy Budi and Katie Neubert are co-chairs of the committee. This year's adopted project is to provide operational costs for the Foodbank for scanners that will allow for greater efficiency.

Sarah then shared a most helpful water fact: that winter dehydration can negatively impact our mental health. Staying hydrated with water helps elevate serotonin and amino acid levels in our bodies.

President Randy then called upon Cathy Ponitz to present the Foundation check award. The recipient was Wright Dunbar District Inc. The funds will be used for the memorial to honor the 41 Medal of Honor recipients in the Dayton (and our Club's) region. Karla Garrett Hershaw accepted the check on behalf of the organization. The other grant recipient was Spectrum New Beginnings, a group of over 50 health professionals that serve West Dayton to ensure folks have the appropriate mental health and self-care needed. Taylor Johnson accepted the award.

Bill Nance then conducted the Rotary Spotlight that featured Deb Tschirhart, the Senior Director of Education for Public Media Connect including ThinkTV PBS, CET PBS and SOITA. Her organization participates in community events and works with educators in STEM programs, early learning programs, and school readiness programs. She made her start in early childhood education. Her hobby is crocheting, and she is always ready for a crochet "sesh" with her Go Bag!

Matt Jessup came to the podium and introduced Russell Kline, Chief Regulatory Officer at DEXA—Drone Express. He oversees DEXA's regulatory and compliance certification efforts. DEXA was formerly known as Drone Express. It was rebranded because Drone Express was too literal a name when describing was DEXA does. DEXA was founded out of Telegrid, which was the sole UAS (unmanned aircraft systems—otherwise known as drones—to Drone Express. Russell walked the Club through DEXA's efforts to work with the Federal Aviation Administration to secure its certification for its DE-2020 drone. Russell explained why drones must comply with FAA rules and regulations and that safety is the number one priority in drone operation.

Many local companies, including Winsupply, Papa Johns and Kroger, use drones for material delivery. He discussed the recent drone sightings, most of which are probably not drones. Rather, they are airplanes. There is no "mother ship" off the coast directing drone traffic. The clueless and careless rule the day when it comes to "drone traffic" and rule compliance. Russell entertained questions from the Club including how low drones are permitted to fly, depending on if the airspace is controlled or not. Operators of drones are strongly encouraged by the FAA to share flight information with airports, so drones don't collide or fall to the ground.
