President Randy Domigan called the meeting to order and asked that Bill Nance lead the Club with Words to Live By and the Pledge of Allegiance. Bill Nance then provided the News of the Day and the weather for the week. Richard Lundin introduced visiting Rotarians welcoming our District Governor, Dottie Meade from the Fairborn Club. Rick Wegmann introduced Phil Parks. Mike Rogers introduced Gabriel Von Aalst, President & CEO of Dayton Live. Kim Bramlage introduced guests Jeff Harper and Elaine Lumonya. Nadja Turek introduced Jana Frank. Fran welcomed online guests Carlyie Roush and Tom Carlisle our visiting Rotarian.

Richard then called on Secretary, Sarah Hippensteel-Hall. Social events coming up are the Jay's Seafood dines out and the Mozzarella-making class (November 21 @ 5:30), which supports the Gem City Market. Fall "Bring a Guest Day" is November 18 with speakers on the topic of the Dayton Convention Center - plan ahead to bring someone who would make a good Rotarian

Rotary Rewards went to Paul Gruner for wearing a Rotary t-shirt under an "Iron Man" costume... he's a superhero with a Rotary logo! Ginger Clark made the Coats+ announcement. She asked that everyone consider making a gift - three more days of the program are left!

President Randy then came back to the podium and called on Bill Nance to do a spotlight with Emily Broughton. Emily's job is with Bottom Line Ohio, Director of External Relations. They got a grant from the Connor Group to bring Bottom Line to the Dayton area. They help underrepresented & first generation college students navigate from high school to college. They serve over 200 students (Trotwood, DECA, CJ, DPS... many more) and there are always more in need. They guide students on applying, how to get funding and scholarships. They advise them through college for up to six years. They also help with "what's next" after college with internships and jobs. She used to work for Cox Media and Preschool Promise. She has media experience in print, TV (was a TV anchor) and radio (she was a radio DJ in Sydney when younger). Check out her videos online singing nursery rhymes with kids - over 70k views. What did she like least about doing radio? She was alone at 17 in a studio and she had to fix anything that broke! For more info on Bottom Line Ohio go to www.bottomline.org.

President Randy then invited Elaine Lumonya to the podium. She is 17 years old from Uganda. She gave her deepest appreciation to the club for being our youth exchange student. She's having amazing experiences! She went to a surgical symposium this past weekend and wants to be a doctor. She is studying at Chaminade-Julienne. Elaine shared that Uganda is the "Pearl of Africa" in east Africa. She went to Gayaza High School, a girls Anglican, 1200 girls where the days start at 4:30 am and ends at 10pm. She shared pictures of her country, popular foods, traditional clothing, her school, classmates, family and (guard) dogs in Uganda. She has over 100 members in her "close" family – its big! She shared delightful family pictures, including family gatherings, graduation and wedding photos. She included a photo holding a baby LION ("they are very friendly" she said).

Randy Domigan then introduced guest speaker, Chris Kershner, leader of our nationally recognized (top 1%) Dayton Chamber of Commerce that represents over 2200 businesses (200k employees) in a 14-county region. Chris shared changes to the Chamber's strategic direction:

- Vision: "to be the most trusted voice of business in the Dayton region"
- Mission: "working shoulder to shoulder with businesses to help them succeed"
- Purpose: "to make it easier to do business"
- Key activities: advocacy, professional development, connections, and delivering value
- They are tailoring everyone to be the "best use of each member's time" because time is the most limited commodity of its members.

The Chamber does not endorse candidates! The Chamber informs its members on candidates' positions on business & they take positions on issues. So what effect would a JD Vance VP have on Ohio? A Senate seat would be open, filled by a sole appointment by Governor DeWine. There is speculation regarding GOP candidates. He shared some names.

Ballot issues: The chamber supports 34 Proposed Levy for the Dayton Metro Libraries, based on the Library's strong support of workforce development; the chamber also supports 35 Proposed Levy for the Five Rivers MetoParks, because the MetroParks promote quality of life and attractiveness for talent. They oppose Issue 1, based on the community impact it could have. They have advocated to keep counties and communities "together" in districts, but worry this issue could threaten that. Instead, the Chamber urges the Ohio General Assembly to take up changes to redistricting.

NATO Summit: Theme is "NATO PA Meets Main Street USA." First time in history that NATO is not visiting a "top 10 city" in the US. Congressman Turner helped secure this visit. It commemorates the Dayton Peace Accords 30th anniversary. We are expecting over 1000 attendees (NATO staff, State Dept. officials, and families) at the Schuster Center and Care Source next Memorial Day weekend:

- May 21 attendees arrive
- May 22-25, reception & sessions
- May 26 closing sessions & departures

They are adding international flights & flights from Atlanta, Dulles, Chicago and JFK that weekend. ALL hotel rooms in Dayton are reserved that weekend. Security is the HIGHEST priority, while making our city still accessible. A section of Downtown will be blocked off, called the "NATO Village" with badge-only entry to that zone. Visit the special section of the Chamber's website for info, with more info about closures, traffic, wayfinding, etc. coming in Q1 of 2025. There may be some volunteer activities and some cultural activities that club members could participate in. There will be investments made in downtown, like better signage, that will be lasting and there may be opportunities to host for future NATO submeetings if all goes well.

Chris was asked, will the Dayton & Cincinnati chambers ever combine? The Census bureau boundaries are followed by chambers and the Bureau says the two won't combine. But there is already a lot of collaboration between the two Chambers.

Chris Kershner took a few questions from the audience then drew the queen of hearts ticket. No Queen was shown so the pot continues to grow.
