Service To Youth Award Recipient Honored

On Wednesday, February 12, 2025, the Westerville Sunrise Rotary Club honored **Caley Baker**, Principal at Hanby Elementary School, with a Service to Youth award for her outstanding dedication to our local students and her staff.

Ms. Baker is always available to staff and students, often having lunch with the students and playing games with them. She listens carefully to staff and student struggles and wishes, taking time to reflectively think of solutions to meet most people's needs, and then follow through with actions. She knows all the students, their families and their circumstances.

Dealing calmly and fairly with problems and challenges, Ms. Baker has a voice and demeanor that is unflappable. She will sit on the stairs with students patiently waiting for them to calm down enough to talk about what was happening in the classroom and then suggests alternative ways of dealing with whatever issue set the child off.

Ms. Baker supports her staff so that they can support the students, including ensuring they had training in trauma informed instruction in response to behavior problems in the school. She manages change effectively, making sure teachers had planning times, programs, materials and resources to successfully change the focus of the school's magnet program to STEAM. And she supports the teachers and students in the gifted program, leveraging her deep understanding of the exceptional abilities and struggles of gifted children.

Service to Youth award recipients receive an engraved plaque, as well as a gift card and box of cookies from Kroger. They are invited to join a Rotary Club breakfast in May and will be honored with a flag at The Field of Heroes event Memorial Day Weekend 2025.

Mashuuru Water Project Update

Thank you to all who participated in the fundraising efforts for the Mashuuru Water project this past summer and fall. Our collective efforts raised over \$3,000 and we are already putting these funds to use towards collecting information necessary to apply for a Rotary International Grant.

We have a great core working group: Kavita Tanna, Nick Salmon, and Samson Nyikuri with Globally Reconnect, and two Rotarians in Kenya, Patrick Karuga (Rotary Club of Ongata Rongai) and Chief Hummingbird (Rotary Club of Nairobi Parklands). Earlier this month, our club funded a water feasibility study to determine the water needs of the community - short and long term, assess the ability and willingness of the community to support and sustain the project into the future, and to identify all possible sources of water.

The onsite team shared there is strong community support for the project, however, the initial source water study yielded options that would not be approved by Rotary International or were deemed insufficient to supply the community's water needs. A hydro-geologic survey has been identified as the next step and our club has authorized the funds to move this forward. We'll continue to update the club on the Mashuuru Water project as it develops.
