The Rotary Club of Westerville is joining with <u>Westerville Education Challenge</u> and <u>The Big Bus</u> to support an upcoming event for an important cause. The Club will stage a **Fill The Big Bus Middle School Food Drive**, and incorporate it into the **Westerville Education Challenge's** <u>Night of Hope 5K</u>, set for the evening of Aug. 24 at Westerville North.

"Basic needs must be met for students to thrive and hunger should never stand in the way of their success,†Club President Brandy Deichert said. "Inspired by the heartfelt concerns of middle school staff about food insecurity, we launched the **Fill The Big Bus Middle School Food Drive** to take steps to ensure no student worries about their next meal. Together, we can make a significant impact on their lives and create a brighter future for Westerville.â€

Deichert said the coordinated effort grew from conversations with Minerva Park Middle School Counselor Jill Huck and Minerva Food Service Manager Lauri Jones. They mentioned a fill the bus food drive, and further conversations with Rotarian Tracy Davidson â€" also a Westerville school board member and board member for both The Big Bus and Westerville Education Challenge â€" grew into Fill The Big Bus Middle School Food Drive.

About WEC and Night of Hope

An all-volunteer organization that started in 2009, the Westerville Education Challenge has supported more than 10,000 students through scholarships, mentoring clubs, grants for teachers, programs such as Challenge Day and mental health and wellness initiatives.

More than 1,500 community volunteers and 40 corporate and community sponsors partner with WEC and their contributions include thousands of volunteer hours and more than \$400,000 in donations. WEC's Night of Hope 5K, 1 Miler and Family Fun Run raises funds for a variety of initiatives and programs that support student wellness and mental health in Westerville City Schools, including:

- The Hope Squad suicide prevention program
- Parent Prep workshops
- Where Everybody Belongs (WEB) program at the district's five middle schools
- LINK Crew program, launching at all three high schools this fall
- Care for Twinkle, a district Canine Companions facility dog based at Westerville South High School
- Annual WEC-sponsored scholarships for high school graduates

This year, WEC's 3rd annual Night of Hope 5K, 1 Miler and Family Fun Run on Aug. 24 will honor those lives lost to suicide, and work to raise mental health awareness in the community. Registration opens at 5:30 p.m., and the 5K begins at 6:45 p.m. Register for the Night of Hope here. More information on the event is available here.

There are opportunities for 2 additional host homes for the 2024-2025 year. Host families receive support from the Youth Exchange committee. Host homes do not have to be Rotarians. If a host home does not live in the Westerville North attendance area, the host family would need to provide transportation for the student to attend Westerville North high school.
