Star House Monthly Dinner



Make a difference for homeless youth at Star House by helping prepare or serving a family meal. Westerville Sunrise Rotary, in partnership with our friends in the noon club, hosts a Family Dinner once

a month on Mondays. Our remaining Mondays in 2024 will be:

Anyone can help prepare a meal. You do not need to attend the dinner, and there are often items needed that do not require cooking. Items can be brought to the dinner, or dropped off at a location in Westerville prior to the dinner.

We also need four or more people to help with serving meals. In order to serve meals at Star House, you must be registered as a volunteer with Star House, provide emergency contact information, have a background check completed and complete a trauma training.

If you are interested in volunteering at Star House, register here. Indicate you are with the Westerville Rotary Club in the comment section. Once your form is received, you will be sent information on the background check and trauma training.

Arrival time for meal set up at Star House is 5:30 pm, with the meal served at 6 pm. Clean up after the meal should be completed by around 7:30 pm. Volunteers will enter through the front door and sign in prior to serving.

There are opportunities for 2 additional host homes for the 2024-2025 year. Host families receive support from the Youth Exchange committee. Host homes do not have to be Rotarians. If a host home does not live in the Westerville North attendance area, the host family would need to provide transportation for the student to attend Westerville North high school.
