Colerain School Holiday Party

First of all, Jim Wojta and I as co-chairs want to thank Rotarians for their time, talents and treasures to fund this service project and for the many volunteers who joined last week.

Our Rotary club's history with serving the severely orthopedically challenged youth began in 1920. For a great many years, it has been to host a Christmas party at Colerain Elementary School for all the students both the physically challenged (50%) and neighborhood/mainstream (50%) of the 185 students. This was our 104th year of our continuous service project. We contribute funds from our Foundation service project allocation for teachers to buy presents for each of their students.

We held a "Wrapping Party" on Monday, December 16th after school. We had a strong turnout of 15 volunteers. Two spouses of members and a coworker of a Rotarian joined the "wrapping party". Santa would have been proud of our efficiency (just over one hour) and fun times laughing while wrapping 185 presents. Please ask Nanci McCorkle about her work years ago at the Limited wrapping gifts. Priceless!

On Friday, December 20th, the student's last day of school before holiday break, Colerain held a Winter Fest. Students, teachers and staff wore festive holiday pajamas. We had a big turnout once again as Rotarians were joined by a few spouses, one's mom, a daughter, a son, and a granddaughter wearing Rotary blue/logo Santa helper hats. Twenty-one classrooms came through the library to be greeted by all volunteers and Santa (a new helper as Santa this year) gave each student a gift, a high five and/or a hug. A Rotarian/volunteer walked back with each challenged student to their room and helped unwrap the gift celebrating the joy with the student.

It was an emotional morning and as Nelson French would say it was a feel good "Warm fuzzy".

In addition to the students' excitement and joy, our service project lifts the teachers and staff too who thank us more than we deserve. Their dedication to the physically and mentally impaired students is with heartfelt care.
