PROGRAM

Heather Burkhart introduced our program of **Rob Montagnese**, CEO of Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS).

Rob Montagnese presented on the Summer Events and Activities at LMHS. Summer has historically been a slower time for the hospital system, but that has changed and evolved over time. There is a lot of action at LMHS over the summer! Some of the programs include:

- ActiveFit: for kids ages 6 to 12 to encourage them to be active, get outside, and experience real life. Junior Chef collaboration with CTEC, family movie nights, bowling, field days, and mini-triathlon. Coming up in 2025: a pool/swimming event and a ninja warrior course!
- Active Senior: focused on nutritional, mental, and social health, in addition to
 physical wellness. There is a dance, family feud, Walk with the Docs, Pickleball
 matches, yoga, and a culmination party at the end of the summer.
- Summer Camps:
 - Camp Feelin' Fine: for kids with asthma
 - Camp Cool: focused on kids ages 6–12 experiencing mental health symptoms
 - Mind Matters: on the heels of Camp Cool, Mind Matters was developed to continue mental health support for kids ages 13–18
 - CampMed: for rising seniors who are interested in pursuing a career in healthcare
- Summer Services:
 - LMH Sports Screenings are offered for athletes, with a critical heart screening included
 - Reunion Events: it's nice to facilitate an opportunity for patients to come back and connect with their physicians and nurses, including the Special Care Nursery, the Acute Inpatient Rehabilitation Reunion, the Interventional Cardiology Reunion, and the Cancer Survivor Picnic (all survivors are welcome regardless of whether you received your treatment at LMH or not).
- Hartford Fair: LMH purchased the prize steer at the fair and then all the meat is donated to the Salvation Army, which provides enough meat to feed families for months.
- LMH, in partnership with the Food Pantry Network of Licking County, is now a site for the FPN Market.
- LMH is a consistent supporter of the Canal Market District.
- This summer, there were 1600 participants in the LMH 5K held at Dawes.
