## PROGRAM

**Chan Cochran** introduced today's guest, Lieutenant Governor, John Husted. Lieutenant Gov. Husted is from Montpelier, Ohio in the northwestern corner of the state. He went to the University of Dayton where he was an All-American Defensive back on the football team that won the Division III national championship in 1989. After college, Lt. Gov. Husted worked in economic development for the Dayton, Ohio Chamber of Commerce before entering state government where he has held numerous roles. Lieutenant Governor Husted has been an incredibly effective Lt. Governor, particularly in the area he is most passionate about: economic development.

Lieutenant Governor Husted shared his views on the current state of things in the State of Ohio. He is proud of the work that has taken place over the last 30 years to transform Ohio into one of the most sought-after states in which to do business. CNBC recently ranked Ohio No. 7 in its list of "Best States in which to Do Business" (after being ranked 37th not too long ago). Governor Husted shared his belief that Ohio truly is the "Heart of it All." We make things that power our economy and he is proud of that and it's something that we can be proud of. The new Intel chip-making plant is an important piece in the future of American manufacturing and the re-shoring of a vital component in our national interest. Lieutenant Governor Husted also remarked that Central Ohio and Licking County in particular are benefiting as much as anywhere in Ohio from Ohio's economic resurgence, but there are challenges that come with change. Housing, infrastructure, and a solid, long-term vision are required to ensure a successful future.

Mr. Husted then took time to answer many questions from the audience.
