PROGRAM

Rob Montagnese introduced today's guest, John Keller, M.D., a physician at Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMH). Dr. Keller is in the LMH Cardiac Electrophysiology department. Electrophysiology is the study and treatment of your heart's electrical system. Dr. Keller explained that although the heart is a pump, it is the heart's electrical system that allows the heart to work in sequence.

The LMH Cardiac Electrophysiology Department treats several conditions. These include cardiac arrythmias (irregular heart rhythms), heart failure, syncope, and cardiac arrest/ sudden cardiac death.

Dr. Keller discussed the diagnostic tools at their disposal and available treatments. He provided the audience with valuable information regarding the heart, its many conditions, and the local treatments available. Dr. Keller then answered numerous questions from the audience.
