#### **PROGRAM**

**District Governor Gary Baker** introduced today's speaker, Bill Grindle, District 6690 Foundation Chair.

Bill started by explaining that the Rotary Foundation's mission is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace by improving health, providing quality education, improving the environment, and alleviating poverty.

For 16 consecutive years, it has been a four-star nonprofit as rated by Charity Navigator.

There are three different funds: PolioPlus, the Annual Fund, and the Endowment Fund. Our district has a goal of raising \$200,000 for PolioPlus, \$300 for the Annual Fund, and \$500,000 for the Endowment Fund this year.

Every dollar donated at the local level gets invested at the international level for three years, and then it comes back to us to use at the district level.

Global grants are available to support large, long–term projects. They range from \$30,000 to \$400,000. They must have sustainable, measurable outcomes and involve international partnerships.

District grants are available to support local or international projects Clubs are required to complete training, and then the district will provide a match of up to \$2,000 for the club's investment.

PolioPlus launched in 1985. More than 2.5+ billion children in 122 countries received the vaccine. The vaccine costs \$0.60, but for every dollar donated to the Rotary Foundation is matched by the Gates Foundation 2:1.

The Rotary Peace Fellowship is designed for leaders with work experience in peace and development. Our fellows are committed to community and international service and the pursuit of peace. Each year, The Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and up to 80 for certificate studies at premier universities.

Disaster Relief is also extremely important. Funding for disaster relief is distributed in three phases: immediate relief, short-term assistance, and long-term rebuilding.

There are multiple ways to be recognized by the district for your giving to the Rotary Foundation, including the 125 Club, PolioPlus Society, Paul Harris Fellow, Paul Harris Society, Major Donor, and the Bequest Society.
