Visiting the Largest Rotary Club in the U.S.

Delene and I visited the Rotary Club of Birmingham (known as Magic City) last week at the invitation of their president, Bruce F. Rogers. President Bruce and the club's new executive director, Lora Blalock, treated us to dinner and then provided a tour of their facilities the next morning. We were able to learn about the club, which is the largest in the U.S., and the incredible civic investment the entire city of Birmingham supports, including having the nation's largest Kiwanis Club as well. The [Rotaract Club of Birmingham](#) is also one of the [largest in the world](#), with 300+ members!

The Rotary Club of Birmingham is particularly focused on education and on preventing cervical cancer in several countries around the world as well as at home in Alabama. I was able to share about our work with the West Louisville Housing Fund and the Gun Violence Reduction committee. Birmingham unfortunately experienced a mass shooting just days before our visit that left four people dead and multiple people injured. All in all, it was a worthwhile trip, and we are pleased to have shared time with these great Rotarians!

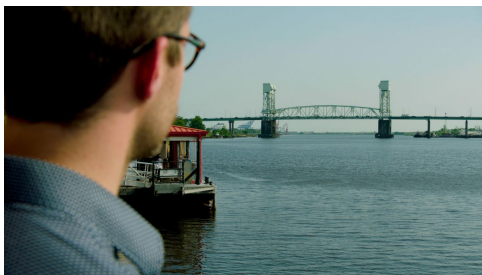
