This is a project that Rotary New Tampa and 12 other clubs supported: Colin & Robyn Beach from our club were very involved with this effort. Hope for Liver Cancer Patients in Egypt is now complete. 27 Rotarians traveled to Egypt last month to meet members of our host club - Cairo Elite. Photos are from screening clinics in Mansoura Village near Sherbin, which is about 100 miles NE of Cairo. Members of Cairo Elite are all wearing red vests. Educational materials were handed out that focused on identifying signs and symptoms of liver disease. A tour of the Egyptian Liver Research Institute and Hospital was given by Dr. Farahat, who has been vital to this project. The hospital is a modern 100 bed facility with 14 specialized outpatient clinics. Also, a picture of a patient undergoing a medical procedure for liver cancer and pictures of the nurses' training sessions. Overall, this grant paid for 45 patient procedures and specialized training for 40 nurses.
