Guest Speaker/Program

Area Governor Kelly Kittner introduced our guest speaker, **Mr. Todd Freesemann**, District Governor for District 6920. Mr. Freesemann has 21 years of service with Rotary following a distinguished 30 year career in the Army and Air Force. He also currently serves as a Deputy Sheriff in Chatham County and is a Will Watt Fellow and a Paul Harris Fellow +8.

Todd shared with the club that District 6920 includes 2700 Rotarians from 59 clubs across the eastern and southern parts of the state down to I-95 and up to Macon. We are part of a worldwide organization made up of 40,000 clubs and 1.4 million members.

His area of focus during his time as District Governor is for clubs to focus on peace building and conflict resolution. He asked that we all try to build peace within ourselves, that we take care of ourselves and that we try to de-escalate conflict within our club and our communities.

He says that membership is our number one priority as all clubs need to be focused on growing its numbers to replace members who retire or withdraw from the club.

President Surendra led us in reciting the four-way test and then adjourned the meeting.
