Guest Speaker/Program

Past President, Ed Presnell, introduced our guest speaker, **Ms. Michelle Pippin**, CEO of the Augusta Sports Council. The ASC is a 501c3 founded in 1991 to create and develop programs and events that would benefit the local community and increase revenue from sports tourism.

Their funding is provided through grants, sponsorships, and registrations from the various events they host each year including the Augusta ½ Marathon, the Nike Peach Jam, the Gridiron, the Military World Softball tournament and the Ironman just to name a few. The Council only has 3-4 employees and rely heavily on over 2,000 volunteers to assist with all of the various events.

They are also the owner of the Ray Guy Award honoring the nation's best punter which is given away each year by ESPN. The ASC generated approximately \$27.6 million in economic impact from hosting 11,950 athletes who booked over 20,000 hotel room nights. This translates into approximately \$847 per household in reduced taxes for local taxpayers.

Funds raised are returned to the community in the form of scholarships to athletes and grants to help teams run their various leagues and programs.

President Surendra led us in reciting the four-way test and then adjourned the meeting.
