Guest Speaker/Program

Ed Presnell, Past President and Past District Governor, introduced our guest speaker, **Mr. Brad Usry**, Chair of the New Arena Committee for the Augusta Richmond County Coliseum Authority. Brad introduced several of his guests, including Mr. Cedric Johnson, Chair of the Coliseum Authority.

Brad provided an update on the current project to demolish and rebuild the James Brown Arena. This project has been approved by voters and included in the most recent SPLOST funding.

The new arena is following the renovation of the original Bell Auditorium which was funded with \$17.5 million in SPLOST dollars. The Bell Auditorium will be connected to the arena to provide easy access and transition between the two structures.

The new arena will feature 10,500 seats, 14 luxury suites and boxes, and will create 600 new jobs. The groundbreaking took place on June 25, 2024 and is expected to be completed by Spring 2027.

One of the enhanced features of the new arena will be the return of an ice rink which will allow for 45 more days of attractions including hockey games, ice capades, and ice skating. Adding ice will increase the number of jobs created, the number of hotel stays booked, and will increase tax revenues by 22% over estimates without a rink.
