Guest Speaker/Program

Haskell Toporek introduced our guest speaker, **Mr. Roy Simkins** with the Augusta Tree Commission. Mr. Simkins is a certified arborist and former member of the Georgia House of Representatives.

Mr. Simkins gave a brief presentation on Augusta's history of government, which included having a now dissolved Trees and Parks Department. While in existence, the department worked with Augusta's Planning Commission to insure all projects considered the current and proposed tree and landscape changes.

Since being disbanded, the Planning Commission has been more focused on asphalt, concrete, and steel and have essentially ignored any tree management considerations. As a result, historic trees are being removed causing the city to be hotter and increasing energy cost for everyone impacted. This has made the "Garden City" less of a garden and less appealing to all who visit.

Mr. Simkins encouraged all attendees to pay attention to what is happening in the community and to get involved with the local media and local commission to make sure the remaining trees are not destroyed unnecessarily.

President Surendra led us in reciting the four-way test and then adjourned the meeting.
