Bob Evans came forward in introduced our guest speaker today, Lt. Governor Geoff Duncan. LTG Duncan has served Georgia since he was elected to the House of Representatives in 2012. He successfully ran for LTG in 2017 and took office in 2018.

During his time in office, he is most proud of helping pass the Hate Crime Bill and more than 50 healthcare bills that help Georgian's get better care at lower costs.

Duncan has announced that he will not run for re-election, but will instead work in the political arena to help fix the Republican Party. In his words, he is "drawn to have a conversation with America" so that he can help find solutions to a broken political process. He has written a book, *GOP 2.0*, which outlines his ideas for reforming the party. The core of his plans involve engaging with the 4Cs; churches, charities, corporations, and citizens, to work together.

His personal philosophy has always been "policy over politics" and he hopes to use his leadership experience to bring people together to think seriously and creatively to improve the country.
