Guest Speaker/Program

Cliff Richards introduced our guest speaker, Russ Gambill, Vice Chair Augusta Canal Authority. Russ gave the club an overview of the Master plan for the new Whitewater Park project. He mentioned it would be the only one of its kind in the world. They settled on a location next to the first level of the canal on land now being used as a lot for county vehicles.

In many ways, the park would have features of an in-stream whitewater park that uses natural water flow and obstacles to create challenges. It would also share some qualities with so-called pumped parks that recirculate water in a more closed system.

The channel will be constructed, similar to a pumped park, but will be adjacent to the canal and able to be gravity run without pumps, similar to an in-stream park.

The project would be fed by water through sluice gates on level one of the canal systems. Flows would then wind their way through a concrete channel that would be the primary attraction for kayakers and rafters. This canal would discharge into the existing channel at the bottom pond.

The project comes in with a projected cost of over \$20,000,000. The Canal Authority will be looking to the Augusta Commission's SPLOST 9 budget and hope there are funds available.

President Surendra led us in reciting the Four-Way Test and adjourned the meeting.
