## **Guest Speaker/Program**

Dr. Paul Dainer introduced our speaker, Dr. Lily Henson, CEO of Piedmont Augusta. Dr. Henson is a board certified neurologist and comes to Augusta following her time as CEO of Piedmont Henry County,

Dr. Henson shared information on the Piedmont Health System which includes 22 hospitals, 19 acute care facilities, 3 inpatient units and over 37,000 employees. That is in addition to a two million dollar annual investment in the community.
