Homeless Alliance Chairman Speaks to Rotary

Ken Taft, chairperson for the Okefenokee Alliance for the Homeless (OATH) was the guest speaker at last week's Rotary Club meeting. OATH serves the homeless in Pierce, Ware and Brantley counties out of an office in Waycross at 115 Albany Ave. In 2024, OATH served 379 clients – 92 children, 236 adult and 59 seniors (60+ years old). They helped place 16 client in housing and saved 10 clients from eviction.

The Alliance served 6,100 hot meals to clients last year. OATH helps their clients acquire documents necessary to apply for housing and connects them with assistance programs they qualify for. They provide tents, toiletries and other supplies as needed. OATH also hosts 'All Recovery' meetings twice a week in partnership with Unison Behavioral Health and the Southeast Health District.

Last year, OATH hosted 50 recovery meetings with 150 in attendance and distributed 281 overdose prevention kits. OATH currently employs a HOPE Coordinator, Healthcare Navigator and an administrative assistant. The local nonprofit receives no federal or state funding and relies primarily on local partnerships and sponsors to fund their operating budget.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace, OUR MISSION IS NO KID SLEEPS ON THE FLOOR IN OUR TOWN!

One of the most humanitarian projects that any club can promote is one that serves children. One of these is a goal that NO KID SLEEPS ON THE FLOOR IN OUR TOWN. This is a goal that the Hinesville Rotary Club has adopted, and former club president and current Area Governor (of District 6920) Terry Cook shared this project and the Hinesville club's current involvement with Glennville Rotarians last week at their club meeting on March 5, 2025.

According to Cook, each year the club makes Christmas brighter for children by partnering with My Journey Home. My Journey Home collects a "wish list" from the children and shares those with the Hinesville Rotary Club. "One year, we saw that several children had wished for a bed, not a bicycle or a toy. The children had wished for a bed; they slept on the floor and had never slept in a bed. This touched us deeply that we had children in our own community who did not have a bed to sleep in every night," said Cook.

Two years later, the club delayed no longer and began to discuss how they could make a difference in the lives of their community. This need for a bed was driven home to the club members when Roger Hutchinson, a club member who works in pest control, told how he and his team would encounter homes with children sleeping on the floor, on piles of clothing, or in a chair.



"That evening in July of 2023, the GA-Hinesville Chapter of Sleep in Heavenly Peace was started," said Cook. "According to ongoing research and data gathered from 2018 to year to date, roughly three percent of the total population represent

children sleeping on the floor, couches, or in uncomfortable situations," he said. "The Hinesville chapter has built and delivered 40 beds during our first year. This year, we have delivered 20 beds already, and we are on track to deliver over 100 beds before the end of 2025. We currently have 119 kids in Liberty County who need a bed. Those children range in age from 3 to 17," said Cook. Sleep in Heavenly Peace began with its first chapter in 2012, and at the end of 2024, approximately 300 chapters are answering the need for children to have a bed in which to sleep every night.

Valdosta Rotary Club Brings Hope to LAMP with Hurricane Helene Relief Efforts

In response to Hurricane Helene's devastation, the Valdosta Rotary Club supported the community by donating food and hygiene supplies to LAMP (Lowndes Associated Ministries to People) for Hurricane Helene relief efforts.

The supplies included sandwich meat, peanut butter, jelly, bread, fresh fruit, snack bars, chips, household staples like toilet paper, paper towels, cleaning supplies, and laundry detergent. These items were assembled into relief kits that Rotarians distributed to the individuals and families served by LAMP.

In addition to donations, Rotary members served lunch to the homeless and others in need, creating moments of connection and compassion during a challenging time.

"LAMP has experienced a significant increase in people needing help, especially in the wake of Hurricane Helene," said Valdosta Rotary Club President Mark Manchester. "As Rotarians, living our motto of 'Service Above Self,' we were proud to provide desperately needed supplies and help make a meaningful impact during this critical time."

Tom Gooding, who chaired the Valdosta Rotary Club's efforts, said, "LAMP works tirelessly serving the homeless, destitute, and others in need. Being part of this initiative allowed us to make a meaningful impact and strengthen our community in a time of great need."

The Valdosta Rotary Club's donation to LAMP was funded by a \$2,500 Rotary District 6920 Hurricane Helene Disaster Relief Grant, plus \$350 donated by the Moultrie Rotary Club. The Rotary International Foundation provided Rotary District 6920 with a \$25,000 Hurricane Helene Disaster Relief Grant, divided among ten Rotary Clubs in communities significantly impacted by Hurricane Helene's destruction.
