### An Update on Georgia Rotary Student Program

Georgia Rotary Student Program Chair Ian Bond honored Frank E. Bentley, Jr., Rotary Club of Sandy Springs and M.A. "Doc" Jaleel, Rotary Club of Peachtree City as well as J. Milton Heard, IV, Rotary Club of Macon, with respective resolutions and proclaimed them each as Trustee Emeritus members in late January.

More than 50 GRSP Trustees along with the GRSP Foundation Board of Directors met in Macon to discuss administrative and financial reports as well as honor members in the Winter Business Meeting. GRSP Foundation President Terry Adkins also thanked Bentley for serving as the Foundation's financial advisor for the past 30 years and presented him with a crystal bowl etched with an outline of the world map and the GRSP logo for his dedication to the program.



Heard was appointed as a Trustee in 2011, and later named as District 6920 Director of GRSP. He is a Ronnie Waller Fellow with the GRSP Foundation, which represents contributions of \$10,000 or more. Heard, along with his wife Laura, has been a host family and documented multiple GRSP Conclaves and events with his passion for photography. Jaleel served District 6900 as District World Community Service and 3H Grants Chair from 1985-1993 and as an Area District Governor from 1998-2001. ## GRSP Barbara M. and Donald L. Thomas Peace Award

The Georgia Rotary Student Program (GRSP) recently celebrated two outstanding scholars who embody the spirit of peace and understanding among their peers and nations. This celebration coincided with Rotary International's 120th anniversary on February 23, which also marks World Understanding and Peace Day, honoring the date of the first Rotary meeting in 1905.

Two GRSP scholars were recently honored in their respective host Rotary Club meetings. Committee Chair John Carruth, representing the Roswell Rotary Club, presented the Barbara M. and Donald L. Thomas Peace Award to Shifa Maherali Jiwani of India and Jordan Laurent Noueku of Cameroon. Both scholars will also be recognized at the Georgia United District Conference in April.

Shifa Maherali Jiwani, a student at Kennesaw State University, is sponsored by the Rotary Clubs of East Cobb and Paulding County. She immediately became involved in the U.S. healthcare system and began her research into antimicrobial resistance as a freshman. Her research has the potential to save millions of lives worldwide, making her stand out as an exceptional candidate for the Peace Award.

"We were very impressed with her desire to become a healthcare professional to help overcome the healthcare inequities in impoverished areas of the world, having witnessed them in her native country of India," said Carruth.

Jordan Laurent Noueku, a student at Morehouse College, is sponsored by the Rotary Clubs of Midtown Atlanta, Atlanta West End, and Fayetteville. His letter introduced him as a young man eager to give back with his time and talents, emphasizing the importance of the monetary award in helping him pursue his medical education.

"Jordan's journey has not been easy in pursuit of this goal, with many setbacks and financial struggles along the way—first with being able to come to America, then with high school in San Francisco, and now in college at Morehouse," Carruth explained. "We hope that this award, in some small way, will help you on your path toward becoming a medical technician and giving back to those who have helped you get this far."

Roswell Rotarian PDG Bob Hagan shared that Donald and Barbara Thomas, after whom the award is named, were well-known throughout Georgia for their 1980s rhyming radio and television advertisements for Anchor Savings Bank, where Donald served as chairman. The couple was recognized for their commitment to Rotary and their significant contributions to the Georgia Rotary Student Program.

Both Donald and Barbara Thomas were strong supporters of GRSP. They were recognized as Kendall-Weisiger Fellows, a distinction awarded by the GRSP Foundation for contributions of \$5,000 or more. In June 1992, they established a substantial Charitable
