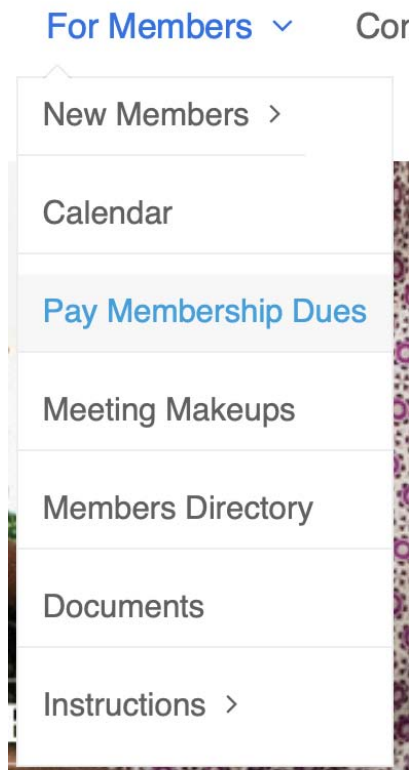

Instructions for Member Directory

easiest way to access the member directory is to go to m.dacdb.com. This works on
your desktop computer or on your smart phone.

members, then click on the member you need contact information for and it will open
up for you.
