ability to serve others. The role played by the governance team is critical to the ongoing success of a Rotary district. The search for dedicated Rotarians to fill these positions is one of our highest priorities.

The Selection Process

The process for choosing a District Governor typically begins two to three years before the new Governor takes office. Some things to consider when becoming a District Governor include:

Requirements

Applicants should have strong leadership and decision-making skills and have previously served as President of a Rotary club.

Responsibilities

District Governors are responsible for strengthening clubs, organizing new clubs, growing membership, and more. The Leadership Team will work together, as a team to:

Visit each club at least once per year in such a way that by the end of the term the District Governor will have visited all of the clubs at least once.

Attend club events and fundraisers, as invited

Work together to assist clubs and committees, as needed

Discuss issues within the District and assist the District Governor to come up with solutions.

Training

District Governor Elects (DGE) attend training at the Zone Institute and International Assembly to prepare for their year as District Governor.

Expenses

Rotary International and the home District pay the expenses of attending training in the governor nominee and governor elect years, and for the governor. The governor elect and the governor also attend the Rotary International Convention as

representatives of our district. Although most of the expenses for the governor are reimbursed, there are many expenses that will not be covered by Rotary International and district allocations, such as gifts for staff or other personal items.


