## Hurricane Helene: DAUSA deployment to Eastern Tennessee October 7 through 12



Dear DAUSA DARTS/Volunteers and Rotarians,

Most of you are aware that Hurricane Helene caused havoc in North Carolina and Tennessee by dumping over 20 inches of rain. Over 100 lives have been lost and many houses have been flooded or washed away. The damage is of epic proportion.

Disaster Aid USA had several strategy sessions to address the suffering of the people. We have decided to deploy to Greenville, TN, where flooding is extensive. Most of the work will involve mucking and gutting and clean up. If you would like to volunteer, here is the plan:

1. A team from MD/DC area plans to leave on Sunday AM (Oct 6) with the DAUSA trailer. Another team from WV will join them at Greenville, TN bringing a second DUSA trailer.
2. Local DAUSA team lead familiar with Greenville disaster, Jamie Baisden, has assembled a dozen Rotarians and non-Rotarian volunteers to work with the DAUSA teams from MD/DC/WV. At the direction of the Green County Volunteer Coordinator, the DAUSA teams and local volunteers will start cleaning houses and do mucking and gutting effective Monday AM, Oct 7.
3. Deployment is expected to continue from Monday, Oct 7 through Saturday, Oct 12. DAUSA team and volunteers will be housed in a church basement; and local Rotarians (from Green County Club Rotary) will provide food services.
4. Each volunteer is encouraged bring a sleeping bag, his/her own gloves, safety glasses and ear protection gear. Extra safety equipment will be available on the DAUSA trailer.

## RLI Graduate Course: A Historic First for District 7620!

### Rotary Leadership Institute Graduate Course: A Historic First!



On Saturday, September 7th, District 7620 made history by hosting its first-ever Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) graduate course! This milestone event also marked the return of a graduate-level course offered by the Mid-Atlantic RLI, which hadn't occurred since January 2020. Alongside this historic graduate course, RLI Levels 1 and 3 were also offered, all expertly organized by the District's RLI Coordinator, Pam Kreis.

The course, "**Exploring the Rich History of Rotary**," was developed by RLI Facilitator Chris Zabriskie. Drawing from a template provided by RLI Northeast America (RLI-NEA), Chris expanded the course to include segments on Rotary's history and traditions, the art of storytelling, and how to best share your club's unique history. The result? A dynamic and enriching experience for the 11 participants who attended.

These participants represented four districts and included RLI Level 3 graduates, RLI facilitators, and one special guest, Jack Huskin. Jack, who had planned to attend Level 2, found himself auditing the graduate class when Level 2 was canceled due to low enrollment.

As with all RLI courses, this was far from a lecture-style class. Instead, it was a highly engaging, participatory experience. Attendees were given reading selections and encouraged to present their reflections to the group. To enhance their storytelling skills, participants shared their out-briefs in a compelling, narrative format. A highlight of the day was the segment on Rotary personalities, where attendees tested their acting chops by role-playing historical figures in first-person narratives—a fun and creative twist that brought history to life!

Dave Roasa, a DAUSA team lead worked with DAUSA team and other local Rotarians and volunteers to clear trees and to do clean up work in small towns of Ohio. ## Remembering a hero of polio eradication: Dr. John Sever, Potomac Rotary Club

World Polio Day, on Oct 24, is a time to celebrate progress and rededicate ourselves to finishing the job of eradicating the disease. Let's also honor the countless Rotarians and Rotaractors who have championed the cause. One such hero was John Sever.

Sever, who died in April at age 92, was a member of the Rotary Club of Potomac, Maryland. An infectious disease specialist

at the US National Institutes of Health, Sever recommended in 1979 that Rotary make polio eradication a global goal, expanding what began as a national vaccine campaign in the Philippines.

It is hard to imagine where we would stand today without Sever's decades of leadership, expertise and advocacy. In August, I was honoured to present his family with the International Service Award for a Polio-Free World and a crystal recognition piece in Sever's name.



What he helped initiate, PolioPlus, became an example of implementing an action plan in Rotary. Thanks to him and the volunteerism and generosity of countless others polio cases have decreased by more than 99 per cent since 1988.

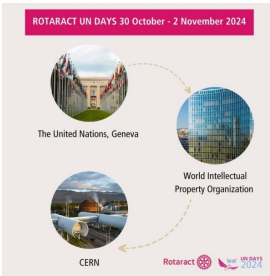

## In Memoriam: Frederick Rotary's Past President Dr. George E. Lewis, Jr.



Our club was saddened to hear of the passing of member and Past President Dr. George E. Lewis, Jr., DVM, PHD, DACVM, COL (RET.) USA, 81, at [Frederick Health Hospice](#)'s [The Kline House](#) on September 22, 2024, after a long and tenaciously fought battle with prostate cancer.

Among his fellow Rotarians around the world, George will be well remembered as a loyal friend, dedicated Rotarian, challenging mentor, first-rate communicator, innovative thinker and logistical genius. During his tenure as our club's President during Rotary Year 2002-2003, President George was renowned as a leader who knew how to "make the trains run on time." George was a highly decorated Rotarian, having earned some of Rotary International's and the Rotary Club of Frederick's most

distinguished honors given for service and philanthropy.

Some will remember George as a local historian who was integral to the rebuilding of the Catoctin Aqueduct, while others will recall George's groundbreaking work at the U.S. Army Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases (USAMRIID) at Fort Detrick, Maryland where he developed medical vaccines, drugs and diagnostics to protect American military personnel from biological warfare agents and endemic infectious diseases. Our sincere condolences to Pam, George's wife of fifty-nine years; his son George III and daughter-in-law, Michele; his daughter, Alisa; granddaughter Alexandria and husband Anthony; his great grandchildren, Savannah, Natalie, and Finley, sisters Janice Pendleton, Judy Lewis Harrell and brother-in-law William Harrell, and his niece and nephews.
