Join The Rotary Club of Capitol Hill to Lay Wreaths at Arlington National Cemetery Dec. 14



For the fifth year, the Rotary Club of Capitol Hill has committed to the Wreaths Across America Day Association to lay holiday wreaths for U.S. military veterans at the Arlington National Cemetery on Saturday, December 14, 2024, from 8:00 am to 11:00 am. For our community service project to be successful, we need "at least" 10 volunteers, but we welcome more. Last year we had 34 volunteers from various District 7620 Rotary and Rotaract clubs.

As a volunteer, you will join hundreds of people at the Arlington National Cemetery and place live balsam veterans' wreaths on the headstones of our fallen heroes. The wreaths are made of fresh evergreens and have been used for centuries as symbols of honor, living tributes and memorials to honor veterans, active-duty military, and their families.

When each wreath is placed, the service member's name is said out loud to ensure his/her memory lives on.

Details

- You can park at the <u>Pentagon City Mall Parking Garage</u> (850 Army Navy Drive, Arlington, VA)
 Meet the group at 7:30 am on the northbound platform at the <u>Pentagon City Metro Stop</u>.
- Ride the Blue Line subway two stops to the <u>Arlington Cemetery Metro Stop</u>.??????
- Note: You do not have to take the subway. You can take a taxi, Uber, or Lift to the main gates at Arlington Cemetery.
- · All visitors will have to clear Security.
- Due to the volunteer lines, it takes between 5 and 20 minutes to clear, so plan to arrive early
- Lay holiday wreaths from 8:00 am to 11:00 am. (3 hours)
- Depart the Arlington Cemetery Metro Stop at 11:00 pm and go back to the Pentagon City Mall Subway.

 Optional -There will be a Holiday Veterans' Ceremony from 12:00 to 12:45 pm for all volunteers. This location will be provided on the day of service.

Special Project Grants are grants of \$20,000 per organization to support larger projects that demonstrate long-term sustainability and impact benefiting DC Area residents.
