

#### **Metro Bethesda Rotary Global Fundraising Initiative**



Metro Bethesda Rotary is excited to announce a global fundraising initiative to raise \$120,000 for a vital project in Cha de Magoma, Gurue, Mozambique. We are working with the host club, Rotary Club of Beira, to assist the needs of a community predominantly filled with Tea Garden workers and their families. Our goal is to assist in a larger initiative to renovate an existing clinic and provide a pathology clinic. The grant seeks to raise funds to equip the newly renovated pathology clinic with the necessary pathology tools

and provide education to new personnel to diagnose and treat critical illnesses such as malaria, anemia, typhoid, AIDS, and heart disease.

Currently, the Cha de Magoma community lacks access to modern healthcare facilities, which has led to poor health conditions and an average life expectancy of just 54.6 years. By supplying the proper equipment and training the staff, we aim to dramatically improve the health and longevity of the 10,000 villagers in and around this area. This project holds the potential to significantly enhance the quality of life for the people of Cha de Magoma, and we believe it can create lasting change.
