FEBRUARY 17, 2025 MESSAGE FROM THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR

Dear District 7630 Rotarians:

March is Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene Month. Clean water is a basic need for all human beings. When people, especially children, have access to clean water, they live healthier and more productive lives. However, at least "85,700 children under the age of 15 dies from diarrhea linked to unsafe water and poor sanitation conditions." However, in the same token, at least 3,000 children die each day from diseases caused by unsafe water, which is what motivates our members to build wells, install rainwater harvesting systems, and teach community members how to maintain new infrastructure.

Saturday, March 22, 2025, is World Water Day, and the sole purpose is to raise awareness of the global water crisis and the 2.2 billion people living without access to safe water. The theme for 2025 will be Glacier Preservation.

"The America that we all believe in is a land of opportunity. But, for historically marginalized communities from Alabama to Alaska, that opportunity is stolen when basic sanitation doesn't work-exposing adults and children to backyard sewage and diseases."

As we move into the month of March, we are more than 2/3 of the way through the Rotary year. Current club presidents are starting to wind-down, while Presidents-Elects (PEs) have been preparing for their Multi-District President-Elect Training to be held in Chantilly, Virginia. The training and the Multi-District President-Elect Training will provide for all the five districts to come together, and to get acquainted.

I would be remiss if I did not mention the wonderful weekend at the Carousel Hotel regarding RYLA. In attendance there were about 100 or more representing all of the district and clubs. The young professionals did outstanding presentations of their projects.





Tidewater Rotary Club Announces 2025 Fundraising Events Benefiting Talbot Hospice




