### Rotary Around the World

#### Malaysia

After providing food and medicine to villagers in Nyamok during the pandemic, the Rotary Club of Metro Kuala Lumpur heightened its assistance to the impoverished community in Pahang state, a five-hour drive from the club base. Rotarians embarked on a project to construct three toilets as well as five kitchens and washing areas for food preparation for the Orang Asli ethnic group. The club lined up a District 3300 grant, other sponsors, and volunteers and then plotted the logistics, including the acquisition of plywood, bricks,



cement, and tools, along with the three trucks used to deliver the materials along muddy roads into the remote village. After three days of construction with help from community members, the job was complete, club member Jennifer Lim says. Members installed more ceramic tiles in March to improve the appearance of the toilet facilities, Lim says.

# CLUB REPORT JULY 18, 2024

he arts hold transformative powers, **Rotary District Governor Robert B. Friend** wrote in his introductory address to Rotarians in southern Connecticut at the beginning of his term July 1.

"Art transcends boundaries, languages, and cultures, allowing people to communicate and connect in ways that words alone cannot," he wrote.

This was Friend's introduction to the district's initiative for the 2024-2025 Rotary year: "Opus for Peace - creating harmony, inspiring wellness, and embracing diversity through the fusion of the arts."


In response to this initiative, the Rotary Club of New London has formed a special peace initiative committee that has begun exploring projects and service that will align with the district's Opus for Peace.

While the district initiative is brand new, Rotary has a long history of promoting and working toward peace. Just before the events that became known as World War I began in 1914, the International Association of Rotary Clubs that is now Rotary International, adopted a statement that Rotary would "lend its influence to the maintenance of peace among the nations of the world." After the war, delegates to the 1921 convention in Scotland amended the group's constitution to include a goal "to aid in the advancement of international peace and goodwill through a fellowship of business and professional men of all nations united in the Rotary ideal of service."

Later, with the world again at war, delegates to the 1940 Rotary convention adopted a statement, "where freedom, justice, truth, sanctity of the pledged word, and respect for human rights do not exist, Rotary cannot live nor its ideal prevail." The statement put the promotion of peace and understanding as integral to the Rotary mission.

One historic initiative aimed at promoting peace and international understanding was Rotary International's decision to award scholarships for graduate study abroad. This first program of the Rotary Foundation was instituted in 1947.

Today, Rotarians have more opportunities to promote and ensure peace, understanding and harmony within their own communities. Said Friend in his introductory address: "By organizing concerts, art installations, and performances, we will create platforms for voices that often go unheard, celebrating diversity and fostering inclusion. These events will elevate our public image and demonstrate Rotary's commitment to unity and understanding."
