#### **Eastern Pequot Nation Pow Wow - Little Free Library Update**

Today was an exciting, commemorative day for the Eastern Pequot Tribal Nation, near North Stonington, CT. It celebrated its annual Pow Wow with hundreds of friends and families in addition to other tribes from the Eastern Seaboard and those who travelled here from all over the nation. The ceremony of the women purifying themselves with sacred smoke from the ceremonial fire, and the families and children celebrating together their heritage was joyous to participate in and watch. The Eastern Pequot Women Elders sold handmade crafts, students from UMASS Boston displayed archeological artifacts they have been studying this summer, and everyone enjoyed delicious food and inspired music and dance.

This was a perfect occasion to check out the Indigenous Little

Free Library donated and installed through a grant secured by the New London Rotary Club (CT) last fall and add the Indigenous Library insignia. The Indigenous LFL located next to the Pequot sacred garden, is a huge hit! Children rushed over to find their favorite books and marvel at the concept of take a book, share a book. They began reading to each other and talking animatedly about their selections. When we first opened the library, we were able to fill it with the donated books from the LFL program that specifically address Indigenous history, customs, and culture for children, youth, and adults. They were stories that we hope everyone could see themselves in and appreciate. As we continue to look for books to inspire our readers, we are

reminded that today's visit with the children was special. The New London Rotary Club is fortunate to have partnered with the Eastern Pequot Tribal Nation for the Indigenous Little Free Library.

# CLUB REPORT AUGUST 1, 2024

### ROTARY DISTRICT GOVERNOR: FOSTERING PEACE THROUGH THE ARTS WILL BOOST ROTARY PUBLIC IMAGE, EXPAND REACH, DEEPEN IMPACT

A ll Rotarians have the ability to reach out to communities not typically a part of their clubs in an effort to expand Rotary's impact and spread service and kindness beyond the confines of their existing club membership.

Robert Friend, District 7980 governor, told members of the New London Rotary Club on Aug. 1 that the 2024-2025 Rotary year should be one of irresistibility. By expanding outreach, carefully assessing long-standing projects to ensure they remain impactful, and thinking of Rotary and service projects in new and different ways, the community will notice and, in turn, want to join the success, he said.

Among the questions Friend said Rotary members should ask themselves are: "Where are the areas we can raise the bar? What are we doing that's really working?" Focusing on answering such questions not only will keep Rotary clubs relevant and important in their communities, but also will draw more membership because people want to be part of successful organizations that positively impact their communities, Friend said.

Friend's main initiative for the district this year is "Opus for Peace." It is designed to foster peace and understanding within communities via the creative process of the arts.

"I wanted to do something that had a profound impact," he said

Friend has been a Rotarian for 23 years. He has served as Foundation Grants Reporting Coordinator and District Grants Steward Chair. He also has served as president of the Madison Rotary Club and, as assistant district governor, boosted club engagement and growth. While Rotary membership has remained relatively stagnant in recent years, Friend said membership in District 7980 clubs is growing.

Friend said he saw the arts as a logical pathway to fostering peace because he's experienced its power firsthand. He's the president of Live Entertainment Solutions Group and has held executive roles at Tony Award-winning theaters.

"Every time I come here, I feel like I'm coming home," he said of New London, noting that he started his entertainment business at the Garde Arts Center.



While global crises such as wars in the Middle East and Ukraine, mass shootings and drug deaths can seem insurmountable, Friend said he envisions Opus for Peace as a way to focus on peace within individual, smaller communities that then can connect to one another for larger impact.

"Peace is very personal," he said. "We can't impact it globally, but we can within us. We need to take care of ourselves first. Until our inner circle is OK, we can't help out in the larger community." This, he said, connects this year's district initiative to last year's that focused on improving mental health

Friend said the New London club is among the first Peace Builder Clubs in the district, laying the foundation for it to expand its reach and increase its impact.

"It's time to talk about peace as an integral part of all we do," he said.
