CLUB REPORT AUGUST 15, 2024

NEW LONDON MARITIME SOCIETY: 40 YEARS AND GOING STRONG

he New London Maritime
Society is responsible for
maintaining an historic
downtown building, the stewardship
of several local lighthouses,
overseeing a maritime research
library and educating the public about
several important aspects of local
history, including telling the story of
the 19th century African mutineers
aboard the ship Amistad.



"We've grown quite a lot," Maritime Society Director **Susan Tamulevich** told members of New London Rotary at the club's regular weekly meeting on Aug. 15.

The Society completed its 40th anniversary year in 2023. Tamulevich recounted that the 1833 U.S. Custom House - formerly an active custom house and now the Society's maritime history museum on Bank Street - was saved and preserved thanks to the actions of a group of local residents. The building was in danger of being demolished in the 1980s after the custom service no longer needed use of the entire granite structure.

Lucille M. Showalter was the New London resident who led the effort to preserve the historic structure and became the founding director of the Maritime Society. She died on May 1, 2000.

Tamulevich provided Rotarians with an overview of the wide range of the Society's current activities and events, as well as the exhibits at the Custom House Museum.

One of the Society's important functions is providing stewardship for three local lighthouses. These are New London Ledge Light, New London Harbor Light and Race Rock Light. The society works to maintain all the lighthouses and also provides tours for the public to visit the structures. The Society also has applied to be steward of the Lynde Point Lighthouse in Old Saybrook, Tamulevich said. If that application is granted, the Old Saybrook lighthouse

also would be accessible to the public.

Besides lighthouse tours, Tamulevich said the Society frequently sponsors other types of trips for the public. For example, a group from the Society conducted an egg and bird count on Great Gull Island, and the Society also sponsored seal watch cruises and other types of trips on Long Island Sound.

"We try to give people the experiences to love Long Island Sound," she said.

At the Custom House Museum, permanent exhibits feature lighthouse models and artifacts, maritime artwork and deep sea diving equipment. The museum also has a permanent exhibit focused on the story of the Amistad mutineers. In 1839, a group of Mende, who were illegally taken from west Africa to the Caribbean, were being transported aboard the ship La Amistad to a plantation in Cuba. The captives seized control of the vessel and the ship then sailed a circuitous route, ending up adrift off the coast of Long Island. There, it was taken by U.S. authorities and hauled into New London. After a long legal fight, the captives eventually won their freedom.

Besides the museum exhibits, special events such as history lectures, concerts and open mic nights are sponsored by the society. The Custom House also is home to the Frank L. McGuire maritime library, which is an important resource for those researching maritime subjects. The museum also hosts the Jibboom Club, a group formed in the declining years of the whaling industry in 1871 by a group of sea captains who gathered to share stories and experiences of their lives at sea.

One current challenge for the Society is its effort to raise enough money to replace the roof on the Custom House, Tamulevich said. The roof replacement is estimated to cost about \$700,000 and about half that amount has been raised, she said.


