DROP-IN LEARNING CENTER SUMMER CAMP OFFERS IMPORTANT LIFE LESSONS FOR CITY STUDENTS

he 61 students who participated in the Drop-In Learning Center's summer camp program this year enjoyed a busy schedule of learning, playing and volunteering, the center's executive director **Reona Dyess** told the New London Rotary Club on Sept. 19.

The students built confidence, strength and skills at a ropes course in Mystic and by practicing Tai Chi. They learned about themselves and their emotions through regular journaling. They took advantage of books and other materials at the Public Library of New London, explored the Connecticut College Arboretum, developed resumes, learned time management and enjoyed swimming and other on-the-water activities. Many of the students were first-time swimmers, Dyess said.

"The kids get to help plan their days," Dyess said. "We used every part of New London."

New London Rotary provided financial support to the summer program. Rotary funds were used specifically to provide financial support to allow New London middle school students to attend the camp.

Dyess said one distinct feature of the Drop-In Learning Center's camp is its duration. Among the numerous summer programs offered in the city, Dyess said the center's 8-week camp is the longest. This provides more support and activities for students who might otherwise find themselves at home alone or spending the summer weeks in less productive ways.

The camp enjoys a partnership with many New London organizations and sites. Besides the library, students visit and go fishing at Ft. Trumbull State Park, go to the Hempstead Houses, Ocean Beach Park and the Hygienic Art Park. At Connecticut College, the students not only get to enjoy the athletic and other facilities, but interact regularly with college students there. This allows the younger students to learn about college, scholarships and various fields of study.

Dyess said the older students in the camp enjoy helping the younger students with various activities. The older students also do community service, such as volunteering at the Gemma E. Moran/United Way Labor Food Center or the St. James Episcopal Church's food locker.



One particularly important activity is learning about their city and its government, said Dyess, who is an elected city council member. They visit City Hall, meet officials such as their state representatives and the city's mayor and see historical documents in the city clerk's office that date back to the earliest days of the city's founding. They also learn about the importance of registering to vote and voting.

"They can encourage their parents," Dyess said.

Dyess said the summer program also is dynamic, with new partnerships and activities each season.

"We're always meeting the needs of our families," she said. "We're always looking for new partners. You have to be willing to grow with the young people you are serving."
