Thanksgiving Turkey Drive

Local families in need will again be treated to free Thanksgiving dinners thanks to Liberty Bank and New London Rotary.

Pam McNulty-Hennessey is again overseeing for New London Rotary the 21st annual drive. The Community Foundation of Eastern Connecticut also has contributed to the drive, as will shoppers at some local food markets. The Liberty Bank Foundation also will contribute 25 cents for every dollar donated, up to \$200,000.

New London Rotary's donations will benefit the New London Community Meal Center, Gemma E. Moran United Way/ Labor Food Center and Salvation Army, all located in the city.

The Liberty Bank Foundation is teaming with the Community Foundation of Middlesex County and 45 local Rotary clubs on the drive. More than \$6,000 already has been raised through online donations. Since 2004, Liberty Bank Foundation in partnership with Rotary clubs throughout the state, has raised more than \$4 million to ensure families have a happy holiday.

record the pictures and raise awareness. To encourage Rotary members, Ball suggested using the slogan "focus on the finish." "The selfie frames have been in continuous use since the event, moving from one club to another," she says.





The Pattagansett Art Center



ur speaker was **Kristine Holohan** co-founder and executive director of the Pattagansett Art Center. She was accompanied by two associates, Brooke and Sarah. After an introduction by Ed Cramer, Kristine told us about the recently founded and evolving local center. Her cofounder is William Potvin. They are still building their team. Her talk was titled "A New Art Initiative." The PAC is still developing its physical campus, its "base-camp". Eventually, the 64 acre site will offer housing for 150. The three pillars of the Pattagansett Art Center are arts excellence, wellness and the environment.



MISSION: The Pattagansett Art Center (PAC) is as an artist-run, creative community-centered land project rooted in the practice of wellness and environmentally sustainable models created through the arts. PAC will focus on the professional advancement of women artists and advocacy for an equitable society through collaboration. She noted the professional inequities between male and female artists.

PAC plans to accomplish their mission through intentional collaboration with diverse groups of artists, makers, cultural practitioners, creatives and the greater community.

VISION: PAC will host a creative cultural space where communities can participate in, view, and support the arts. They will realize this model through sustainable practices centered in inclusion, personal growth and collective wellness. They will reach these goals through: workshops, courses, retreats, residencies, events, exhibitions, performances, contemporary and traditional art collections, and tours.

GOALS: Immersed in a natural woodland environment, the center will build and support communities in harmony with nature through engagement in innovative social practices. They will provide professional facilities, studios, skillshares, facilitation, as well as mentorship to artists and audiences.

VALUES: PAC will be inclusive, safe, diverse, curious, exploratory, environmentally sustainable, communicative, trusting, honest, respectful, compassionate, collaborative, accessible and kind.

To fulfill its mission, the PAC is building strong ongoing relationships with the community including Connecticut College, the Garde Arts Center, Spark Makerspace, Connecticut Conservation Districts, Fresh New London, and the Girl Scouts. Their programming will include: Workshops and education. Residencies. Retreats. Events. Exhibitions and performances. Training of volunteers, docents, interns and apprentices. Rentals. Tours. And retail.

The New London Rotary Club hopes the Pattagansett Art Center will become a vibrant resource in Southeastern Connecticut, creating an inclusive, inspiring, collaborative place for developing artists to pursue their visions and find outlets for their creative work.
