### **2) NAME OF THE PROJECT: Model of United Nations of Rotaract in Mexico (Modelo de Naciones Unidas de Rotaract en Mexico).**

### **3) Projects Goal:**

The Rotaract's MUN in Mexico was developed with the goal having student leaders, Universities and Rotary Partners at a discusión table simulating an UN Assembly to fix different international problems and to create peace solutions through the ideas Exchange, debates and, on the same time, negotiation skills, writing skills, oratory techniques, research. So, this would result on a path to build peace and security in the world and to reach the UN goals.

By involving Rotaract, we have the intention to utilize the organization's tolos and to harness the structure, the knowledge, the goals and the purpose of the active role of the Rotary Members.

As well, we collaborate with no Rotary Members but they have worked on building



peade, they share the same visión and have had the same goals as the Rotary members.

As a result of this joint work, the would be able to develop peace projects based on the Pillars of Positive Peace. An example of this would be the “Positive Peace Meeting”. The knowledge obtained on this meeting can be seen on the Rotaract MUN.

#### **4) PROJECT DESCRIPTION, SHORT AND LONG TERM, BROKEN DOWN.**

##### **Description and development of the Project.**

The Model of United Nations is a simulation of the real situation at UN in an academic and professional context where participants represent a country, calling themselves delegations. These are organized by young students at the high school or university level with support from their academic institutions.

The Model of United Nations of Rotaract in Mexico, is developed by Rotaract members with experience in previous models, this with the aim of merging the structure of the UN with the Rotary International and generate an exchange of ideas on various topics that are discussed within the various committees, and generating resolutions that achieve being part of a greater resolution with a real impact at the United Nations.

At the event, there will be presentations on relevant issues in the international context such as: war conflicts, human rights violations, environment, economic development and growth, trade barriers, conflicts generated by migratory waves and the role that Rotary has as a contributor and adviser to the resolutions in the UN.

For this first edition, 80 people were involved, including delegates, speakers (from the World Migration Organization by the United Nations and consuls representing Mexico abroad), observers, directors, participants from different academic institutions from outside and inside the country, as well as members of Rotary International from around Mexico and abroad. We had the support and alliance of the academic institution "Universidad Autónoma de Baja California", being the headquarters of the "Facultad de Ciencias Políticas y Administración Pública", where the participation of students was encouraged by granting an academic credit with curricular value to the participants of the event.



The committees that were open to be selected by the participants and representing a delegation were the following:

- General Assembly
- Human Rights
- World Trade Organization
- Chamber of Senators
- G20
- Security Council (fully in English committee)

Once the delegates have selected their country and the committee, they must prepare a presentation and share it with the committee members, and the debate begins.

In this model, the focus was mainly on conflict resolution through peace project ideas, because club members who attended the "II Meeting of Positive Peace Pillars" felt necessary to include some previous tools and knowledge in the program to share with the rest of the participants. For this purpose, a Rotaract member was invited to give a Rotary United Nations Role presentation and the different collaboration aspects in the search for peace, the experience as "II Meeting of Positive Peace Pillars" participant and how he has developed and implemented activities as well as peace projects in his community.

The objective is that most of the attendees enrolled in this model be people from different institutions who do not know about Rotary since another objective is that this model works to invite and detect new organization prospects who are interested in creating community impact projects.

### **Description of the project in the short and long term.**

This project offers diverse short and long-term benefits for its direct and indirect beneficiaries. The main short-term objective of this high-impact event is to encourage research, empathy towards other cultures and societies, public speaking, debate and, above all, interaction between the participants and institutions that will help the professional and intellectual growth of the beneficiaries.

Therefore, in the long term we can guarantee a lasting relationship between the participants of the model and the participating institutions, since the friendships and professional ties that this project creates, in the future often reach the workplace, in addition to promoting peace through development of projects as well as creating



empathy for the different conflicts that exist worldwide, encouraging the search for solutions in a collaborative way. In addition, the resolutions reached in the different committees manage to create new alternatives to real problems that are happening and that affect in several of the countries where Rotary International is present and can implement these resolutions to bring peace to the conflict areas most affected by support of the United Nations.

## **5) EXPLANATION OF THE SUSTAINABILITY OF THE PROJECT IN CASE TO HAVE IT.**

We only use digital media for the project's promotion and we encourage to always debate about environmental issues and find a solution in the different committees in the project.

## **6) DIRECT AND INDIRECT BENEFICIARIES BREAKDOWN OF THEIR VULNERABLE SITUATION ATTACHING IMAGES.**

Direct beneficiaries: Participants (Delegates, Co-delegates, Faculties, Observers, Moderators, Chair committee and Presidents, Rotaract Members, Rotary Members and National and International Institutions).

Indirect beneficiaries: Host university, speakers and their institutions or origin organizations, diplomatics, government institutions and non-profit organizations.

Beneficiaries improve their environment by creating empathy for new cultures through research and transforming their way of seeing their equals in the local, national and international environment, in order to create awareness of the situation in which, different communities are either local or International live global problems and understanding that these also affect their daily lives on a small or even large scale.

## **7) LOCATION OF THE PROJECT: Mexicali, Baja California, Mexico.**

It is developed mainly in Universities. On this occasion, the first headquarters will be held at the Faculty of Political Science and Public Administration of the Autonomous University of Baja California. This project can be replicable by any Rotaract club.



## 8) AREA OF INTEREST:

It mainly focuses on the area of interest for the Promotion of peace, Conflict prevention and resolution, however it indirectly covers the remaining areas because in the different committees that are developed to debate among the Delegates, topics of current problems of the different needs that exist in the world, which seek to provide a solution to such problems and which cover different areas of interest.
