- 2) NAME OF THE PROJECT Carpentry shop.
- 3) OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

This project intends to provide participants with knowledge and skills for the carpentry trade. The general objective of the program is to provide the adolescents with techniques and tools used to make wooden furniture through specialized courses.

The objectives are:

- Promote the implementation of carpentry workshops with a formative approach, renovation of educational furniture, implementation of innovations and production of wood products.
- Provide knowledge to use in their homes or to open a new path in the workplace.
- Develop leisure activities linked to existing resources, or their creation, as spaces for youth participation to achieve adequate social reintegration.
- Acquire skills, manual dexterity for the application of different techniques according to the work to be done.
- Anticipate potential risks and implement all occupational health and safety regulations during the workshop activities.





4) DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT, SHORT AND LONG-TERM BREAK DOWN

Class Quota: 20 students. Duration: 6 months (2 classes a week of 2 hours each).

This course will teach how to manufacture: chairs, bureaux, tables, drawers, shelves, TV furniture, shoemakers, etc.

SHORT TERM:

In the short term and during the course they will learn to:

- Work on the different metric systems to measure the woods.
- Describe the usual carpentry tools.
- Safety standards of a workshop with these characteristics.
- Basic knowledge to make wooden furniture.
- Pre-assemble the parts before placing adhesives or finishes.
- Several types of inserts.
- Solve problems that may arise in the carpentry trade.

LONG TERM:

At the end of the course:

- Recognize the different species of wood.
- Use different types of hand tools; electrical and mechanical.
- Make strokes and use the appropriate tool for each project.
- Manufacture furniture individually.
- Repair any type of furniture.
- Polish, paint, lacquer any type of furniture with the most varied methods of application; by hand, with brush, with machines, etc.
- Design your own projects taking into account Standard measures Plan a manufacturing individually.
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- Exhibition of the product (and if the adolescent so desires, the sale of the elaborated product, the produce of which will be delivered in full to the adolescent and his family).

5) EXPLANATION OF THE PROJECT'S SUSTAINABILITY (AS APPLICABLE)

The new carpentry tools will last for several years remaining available for the instructors to use them in future courses, thus ensuring its sustainability, since many 6-months courses (each with about 20 participants) can be taught during the lifetime of the tools (the institution will replace the new materials as needed after the first course).

6) DIRECT AND INDIRECT BENEFICIARIES BREAKING DOWN ITS VULNERABLE SITUATION, ATTACHING IMAGES.





The participants are teenagers (from 12 to under 18 years of age) who are in the process of social reintegration for the commission of a crime, or are at risk of committing any crime indicated by the National Law of the Comprehensive System of Criminal Justice for Adolescents due to behavioral problems, addictions, dropout, violence, aggressiveness, conditions of marginality, etc.

Many 6-months courses will be taught during the lifetime of the tools, each servicing about 20 adolescents.

7) LOCATION OF THE PROJECT

The courses will be held at the Preceptoría Juvenil de Tlalnepantla (Youth Preceptory), belonging to the Comprehensive System of Criminal Justice for Adolescents, where there exists a Carpentry Shop, but our club will provide new carpentry materials and tools for it (the instructors wages will be covered by the Youth Preceptory itself).
