2) NAME OF THE PROJECT: Jornada de la Visión (Vision Day) – Youth for Youth.

3) OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT:

To provide for free 300 vision tests, frames and lenses with graduation 100% new for children of limited resources in need

4) DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT, SHORT AND LONG-TERM BREAK DOWN

According to the experience of our Interact Vallejo Club to carry out Jornada de la Visión (Vision day) for the fourth consecutive year, this project is divided into 4 stages:

Stage 1: Fundraising and Beneficiaries:

- a) Make the purchase and request of 300 lenses to Devlyn Foundation according to the available economic amount.
- b) Define the date of the event according to the availability of the Devlyn Foundation volunteers to carry out eye studies and lens assembly.
- c) Print the requests and socio-economic studies.
(to provide help to children with limited resources)



- d) Make the necessary calls to schedule appointments and visits to Primary and Secondary Public Schools of low resources to deliver the Applications and socio-economic studies , ages from 6 to 18 years.

Stage 2: Organization and logistics.

- e) Visit again the schools to recollect the applications for their review and register.
- f) Passing the information to computer to count with the full base of data for the assignation of attention schedule (50 kids per hour).
- g) Hiring tables and chairs for the event.
- h) Hiring of food and water for the event.
- i) Printing of the “income control”.
- j) Prepare the material for games and activities performance.
- k) Design of the map of working stations, definition and organization of working teams integrated by Interact youth.

Stage 3: Event/Jornada de la Visión

- l) Set tables and chairs according to the map of defined stations.
- m) Receiving of the Devlyn Foundation Volunteers to install the ophthalmologic equipment.
- n) Interact Working Teams stand in each assigned area.
- o) Receiving and register of the young people benefited.
(50 per hour).
- p) Undertaking of the view-exams, putting together the glasses according to the needed graduation.
- q) While kids and young people wait for the delivery of their lenses, they are offered lunch which includes one sandwich, one fruit, one candy and one bottle of water each, likewise games and activities are undertaken by the entertainment Interact team.
- r) The delivery of the lenses takes place.
Note: In case of needing a special graduation, the time for the delivery is from 6 to 8 weeks.
- s) Counting and report of the register.
- t) Cleaning the place and giving back the installations.

Stage 4: Glasses with special graduation:

- u) Monitoring with the Devlyn Foundation for the receiving of the glasses with special graduation.
- v) Assigning a date for the delivery of these glasses.
- w) Informing the school and the families the assigned date for the delivery of glasses with special graduation.
- x) Receiving the kids and young people for the delivery of their glasses.
- y) Report of the closing of the Jornada de la Visión (Vision Day) - The Youth for the Youth.



5) EXPLANATION OF THE PROJECT'S SUSTAINABILITY (AS APPLICABLE)

Thanks to the alliance made with the Devlyn Foundation every year they offer us a very special price to continue with the project, in addition to the support of the Devlyn Foundation the Vallejo Rotary Club also provides an annual donation for the project, this allows us to have the resources every year to continue serving and to be able to grow in number of beneficiaries.

Now with the support of H2H we will be able to secure 300 children.

Also part of this program that gives sustainability is that there is an agreement with the Devlyn Foundation that children benefited from this project will be able to receive adjustments and repairs to their lenses at no cost for as long as they own them.

Direct Beneficiaries: 300 Children and young people from 6 to 18 years of limited resources that require prescription glasses, who do not have the economic possibilities to buy them.

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
