2) NAME OF THE PROJECT : "CALCETITAS". PROVISIONAL REFUGE FOR GIRLS VICTIMS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE.

3) OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT: SUPPORT THE HUMAN RIGHTS OF GIRLS IN SITUATION OF VULNERABILITY. WITH THE OBJECTIVE OF ATTENDING AND SANCTIONING THE CRIMES OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE. IN GIRLS AND TEENS UP TO 14 YEARS OF AGE



4) DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT, SHORT AND LONG-TERM BREAK DOWN: As part of our Social Program "My Family is First". That aims to prosecute an education with positive values and to benefit vulnerable people, in addition to strengthening families, in defense of the social problems that afflict us. We consider it important to integrate the Project "Peace Promotion, Prevention and Conflict Resolution". And join efforts with the Ministry of the Interior of the State of Puebla through the Sub-Secretariat for Crime Prevention and Human Rights to support the "Calcetitas" Shelter, which will be a provisional place to attend to Girls and Adolescents Victims of Sexual Violence.

This refuge will provide girls and adolescents using the Community Center for Prevention and Citizen Participation of the municipality of Izúcar de Matamoros, a space where they receive legal, medical, psychological and educational attention to address the social and health implications: sexual abuse , pregnancy at an early age. The project aims to contribute to the mission of the Center regarding the reduction of risk factors that contribute to the generation of violence and crime present in the municipality where it will be implemented.

The strategy to achieve this purpose will be the installation and equipment of a space inside the Center, which functions as a Shelter for defenseless girls with legal advice service, exclusive doctor-office for users, and their partners and families, who present a difficult situation and of transgressive experience with early pregnancy or not, also receive legal support and information about your Human Rights.

In the short term, legal, medical and psychological, and educational support will be provided so that women, girls and adolescents, and in their case their partners and families, identify viable and peaceful alternatives for overcoming the implications of rape and violence. pregnancy, such as social stigmatization, school dropout, unemployment, poverty, depression, intrafamily and gender violence, abandonment, among others.



In the long term, expand services to children and adolescents and increase the number of shelters in the State of Puebla, as it will be the first refuge in the State of Puebla for Crime Prevention and Assistance, the project will contribute to reducing the factors that they generate violence and crime in the context where it will be applied, through the promotion of sex education, resilience, human rights of girls, boys and adolescents, gender equity, the development of socio-emotional skills and employability.

The “Calcetitas” refuge is supported by the Ministry of the Interior of the State of Puebla and the Sub-Secretariat for Crime Prevention and Human Rights, with the purpose of providing Respect for Human Rights and rescuing girls in vulnerable situations, as well as prevent and fight crime. Based on the Law on the Rights of Children and Adolescents of the State of Puebla, according to what is established in Chapter XIII “On the Right to Access a Life Free of Violence and Personal Integrity.” Article 62. Puebla Mexico.

5) EXPLANATION OF THE PROJECT'S SUSTAINABILITY (AS APPLICABLE) .

An initial investment is requested, which makes it possible to demonstrate the urgent attention of this center. As mentioned above, the budgets by the Government are low and will try to negotiate a budget covered by the municipality (in the case of community centers) or federal (in the case of integral centers), so it is expected that In the medium term, the recurring operating expenses of the Unit will be incorporated into said budget.



6) DIRECT AND INDIRECT BENEFICIARIES BREAKING DOWN ITS VULNERABLE SITUATION, ATTACHING IMAGES .

More than 4 and a half million girls and boys are victims of sexual abuse in Mexico, a country that according to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) has the first place in these crimes worldwide.

Despite being in the first place worldwide in child sexual abuse, Mexico has the lowest budgets to combat this serious problem, since only one percent of resources for children is destined to the prevention and protection of sexual abuse and exploitation, according to the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF).

In the social cohesion survey for the prevention of violence and crime, the National Institute of Statistics and Geography points out that the crime of rape reaches 764 girls, boys and adolescents per 100,000 children and adolescents aged 12 to 17 years , while offensive and groping touches reach 5,889 cases per 100,000 children and adolescents. In the state of Puebla in that same year a total of 457 pregnancies were reached in that population sector. In the case of the municipality of Puebla, the figure was placed in 87 pregnancies of that type.



BENEFITS:

- 1) Girls in a state of defenselessness that require immediate attention in defense of Human Rights.
- 2) Vulnerable families that do not have the resources for physical, legal, psychological and provisional protection.

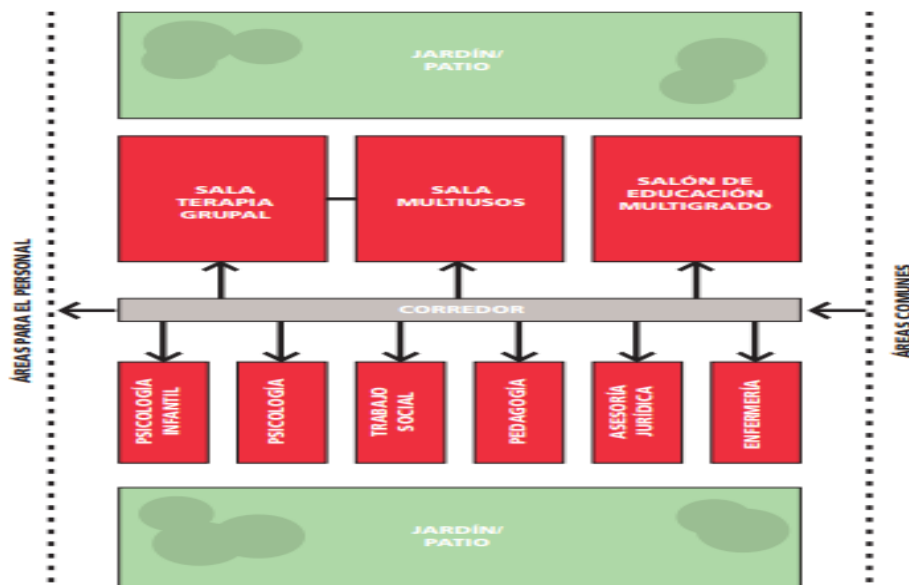
