**Provide wheelchairs to thirty nine older adults with motor disabilities for their mobility and who do not have access to this material due to their precarious socioeconomic situation.**

**4) DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT, SHORT AND LONG-TERM BREAK DOWN**

**We are living in an aging world, more than 10% of its total population are demographic projections, fewer births and lower mortality. The current life expectancy is 77 years for women and 72 for men.**

**In our country, the elderly are still considered as a group in a situation of vulnerability, due to the bio-social and social characteristics that are presented with age and that are accentuated to greater longevity. The appropriate interventions that we do, will allow them to enjoy greater well-being, we must prepare for this situation with infrastructure, equipment, training or training of**

human resources, preventive and rehabilitation programs, as well as integrate in this great task the organized society, the community and families, generating a culture of aging based on human rights for the achievement of an active, healthy and dignified old age. According to the latest INEGI study in the state of Veracruz, there are 798,557 older adults, and in the city of Coatzacoalcos, 8.1% of the population are older adults and only 58.5% of these adults have social security. (Note) Source: Demographic, epidemiological and social profile of the elderly population in the country, a 2015 public policy proposal.

Fortunately, there are support from the federal government such as 68 and more, welfare, state and municipal support that give support to this vulnerable population, however there are older adults with disabilities who do not have these supports because they do not have official documentation or because they have a precarious economic situation and that are received in the municipal DIF of Coatzacoalcos but that due to austerity programs do not meet the needs of this small population and have them on the waiting list to provide wheelchairs to people with disabilities
