

Community Needs

The Tarahumara, located in the state of Chihuahua, live in small isolated villages with a high prevalence of infectious diseases, chronic malnutrition, and infant mortality, all caused or exacerbated by the lack of clean water. The remoteness and scattered nature of these villages makes it impossible to provide water through drinking water networks, high mountain ranges make well drilling costly and not feasible, nor are there other delivery options. The installation of rainwater collection, storage and purification systems is a viable option which also ensures water during prolonged dry spells.

Sustainability

- The project will be conducted in close coordination with the communities served and their elders.
- Construction of the water catchment systems is done by community members under the supervision of the Centro de Acopio Para la Tarahumara (CAPTAR) an NGO with over 20 years experience with water projects in the Tarahumara ensuring a thorough understanding of the systems.
- Training will be conducted in construction, water care, hygiene, environmental, and drainage care as well as water disinfection.
- All training will be done in the Tarahumara language.
