What Is Going On In Forest Grove!

The City's Public Works and Engineering Department has a busy schedule for 2017. We are looking forward to the completion of some projects that will improve life in the Grove. Here are some highlights of a few of them.

OR8/Quince Intersection Improvements: Construction is underway; temporary traffic signal has been installed, and a section of irrigation district pipeline is being replaced. ODOT will be hosting a pre-construction public meeting in the Community Auditorium on March 16th, from 5:30 pm – 7:30 pm. Construction of the new turn lanes will begin in April and be completed this year.

David Hill Road Extension: This project is currently under construction and will connect David Hill Road with Highway 47 utilizing a round-a-bout. Currently the contractor is installing City utilities (water, sewer, power). The project is scheduled to be completed by Spring and is being funded by the County tax dollars through the MSTIP program.

ADA Transition Plan: The City has started the process to develop the Americans with Disability Act (ADA) Public right-of-way (PROW) Transition Plan. The purpose of the ADA PROW Transition Plan (Plan) is to set policies, and procedures to address barriers to those with disabilities within the PROW, and mitigation measures to eliminate the barriers. Barriers which hinder accessibility to those with disabilities include no curb ramps where sidewalks cross a roadway, narrow sidewalks, significant cracks, low overhead clearance, etc

Pacific Avenue & 19th Avenue Safety Improvements: The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) is funding the All Roads Transportation Safety (ARTS) Program for FY2019 through FY2021. This program provides funding for safety improvements based on crash and injury data. City staff identified potential safety improvements along Pacific Avenue and 19th Avenue between Mountain View and B Street (Couplet). The proposed safety improvements to the Couplet include the addition of reflectorized back plates to signal lights and replacement of current pedestrian signals with pedestrian countdown timers at all signalized intersections. The intent of both of these improvements is to improve pedestrian safety on the City's Couplet. The estimated cost for the improvements is approximately \$200,000 of which the City will pay just over \$15,000.

Water: The Engineering Department will be managing a study that will examine the City's water system to determine its ability to survive an earth quake. Vulnerable areas will be identified and capital projects to make improvements will be scheduled. Also, Forest Grove is participating with its Water Commission partners to expand the water plant on Fern Hill Road.

Firwood Lane Sewer Project: Sanitary sewer lines will be extended into this neighborhood and the septic systems will be decommissioned. This project received a grant from Washington County Community Development Block Grant program.
