Measure 98 In The Works At FGHS

Measure 98 is *the voter-mandated ballot initiative providing schools with additional funding for career-technical education (CTE), college-level educational opportunities and dropout prevention strategies* – students now have more resources and supports than ever to help them succeed in high school and beyond.

Every single school district in Oregon has applied for funding, securing their respective allocations and ensuring this long-term investment gets off to a great start. Forest Grove has seized the opportunity to develop a plan that best helps Forest Grove High School students thrive. Measure 98 is not a one-size-fits-all policy – schools are not required to invest their funds the same way. Measure 98 is not a blank check, but its opportunities are boundless. Schools have the flexibility to develop program(s) as unique as the students we serve.

Forest Grove High School has chosen a three-prong approach to Measure 98 funding which includes: increasing our graduation rate while decreasing the dropout rate, expanding and developing career technical education pathways, and developing college credit opportunities.

To increase the graduation rate and decrease our drop-out rate we have implemented the following: created a freshman success class; added an additional counselor as a graduation coach; implemented an ASPIRE program that recruits and trains community members to mentor students on college and career pathways; added an additional position for outreach to families; implemented intensive reading interventions and technology tools for students with and without dyslexia who struggle with reading, writing, and spelling; and hired a migrant grad coach for academic support.

We have developed specific career pathways that support CTE (Career Technical Education) courses including: Building Construction, Culinary Arts, Business, Metals and Machine Manufacturing, Computer Science, Exercise Science, Engineering and Design, Mechatronics, Agriculture Science, Mechanics, and Intro to Education. These career pathways create programs of study for students that will give them advantages in the career and technical education when they leave Forest Grove High School.
