David Mc Donald showed us a huge poster check of our fundraising that can be posted everywhere. We are thrilled with our Crab Feed success.



Our guest speaker, Ronald, is currently dedicated to education to teach citizens how to protect themselves in the event of a workplace violence incident. Ronald has been in law enforcement f or over 30 years, and his training also includes being on a Swat team. He illustrated how we have been taught since 1954 for the "duck and cover" response in case of a natural disaster like an earthquake, a nuclear attack, or a shooting. This is not the best response for all situations, and we would benefit if we learned to open up our response choices to better relate to the situation at hand. We can run, hide, or fight. Ducking under a strong piece of furniture or door way is still a good response for an earthquake, however, always with head held down and protected. Anything we can do as first responders to interrupt the shooter's thought process is helpful, like throwing glasses at him/her. The further away from the shooter you are, the better off you are. Think outside the box...can you create a barricade of some kind? Always teach our children not to talk to strangers,

and if anyone grabs them, teach them to scream and kick like crazy.

In case of major terrorist attacks or school shootings, police arrive in the average of three minutes. Therefore, whoever is present in the room, environment, are the first responders. The first "wave" of officers responding have as their goal taking out the shooter, even if they have to walk over bodies. The second "wave of officers" address the victims, and the medical team.

Remember the shooter expects to die, going out in a blaze of glory, so be aggressive with your decision.

President Chris thanked our speaker, who also took a few questions, and the meeting was closed promptly at 1:30pm.
