The Affordable Care Act established state health insurance exchanges. Exchanges are non-partisan. Through Group Purchasing Organizations individuals and small businesses areaggregated to enhance purchasing power for Americans so they can afford health care insurance. People who do not have health insurance will be mandated to pay a tax of approximately \$600/year. Americans will be able to shop on line for an affordablensurance plan through the exchange. Plan navigators (non-biased people who help individuals purchase insurance through the



exchange) are controversial because they will eliminate the powerful insurance companies and insurance agents from having control over selling insurance plans.
