Jacob Snow, Henderson City Manager. Jacob told us that his first project was the Bruce Woodbury Beltway. As Henderson's City Manager, he has managed the city operating with a \$15 million deficit. The City has had to overcome some bad PR, but they are proud to be named the second safest city in the United States. Henderson has one-half the crime rate of comparable cities. They have an excellent jail with excellent food (let's hope none of us get to



try it!). They have been able to reduce their budget deficit by providing jail space for Immigration Customs Enforcement, having employees willing to take pay cuts; and under-spending their planned budget. Over the past four years they have cut the budget



by over \$120 million while maintain air gices. Jacob hopes to have Henderson named the first local government to operate in the black. He also told the group that he is not optimistic about a stadium being built in Henderson. He is hopeful that Union Village will go forward with a December groundbreaking and the water park looks like a "go."

The Green Valley High School Rotary Student of the Month for October is Darrin Chao.

Darrin is an excellent representative of a high-achieving, well-rounded high school student. Not only does he excel in his Honors and AP classes with a 4.000 weighted grade point average, but he also devotes his time as a student leader and has volunteered one hundred hours at Sunrise Hospital.

Darrin participated on the Green Valley High School Cross Country team for two years and has also pole vaulted for the Track and Field team for three years. His purpose is to be a member of a team which gives a sense of support, more than any other activity.

Darrin is the historian for the National Honor Society and a policy debater for the Green Valley Forensics Team. He is also a violinist in the orchestra and he has been in the top performing group since his freshman year. His Spanish teacher says Darrin works very well with his classmates, making an effort everyday to improve his Spanish. Mr. Ginger says that Darrin is a successful extemporaneous speaker and a four-year policy debater on the Green Valley High School Speech and Debate Team. This year he has taken on the role of being a student-coach, working with the novice policy debaters, helping them better understand how to construct a debate case, cross-examine their opponents and present an effective rebuttal.

Darrin was born and raised in Las Vegas. He is the proud brother of a former Valedictorian graduate of Green Valley High School. His hobbies include rowing at Lake Mead, which he enjoys because it is unique and it relaxes his disposition, in addition to being great exercise. He has been at GVHS since his freshman year. The thing Darrin likes best about school is the absolute support offered by the school for any academic goal that a student would strive to achieve. Darrin spends most of his time playing a substantial amount of tennis, being a member of the Symphony Orchestra, watching television, socializing with friends, completing schoolwork and completing applications for universities and colleges. However, he always ensures that there is sufficient time in his schedule for simply having fun and enjoying himself.

Darrin's plan for the future is to be accepted to Stanford University, where he hopes to graduate with an Engineering degree. He imagines himself surrounded by tech geeks, with a flash-drive hanging around his neck at all times.
