Rotary Recap



Jim S. gave Lauren a quiz on projects, which included the *Corazon*Super Build, a 1-day project with District 5300 which will occur on April 13

Next on the agenda was hearing our program speaker, **Conner Fields.** Connor is an Olympian, who represented the United States in the 2012 Summer Olympics in London, England in the BMX competition. Conner is a 2010 graduate of Green Valley High School, who has been competing in BMX since he was age 7. His career started when his mother saw a flyer at a bike shop announcing BMX racing, and thought it would be something of interest to Conner. By ages 9 and 10, Conner was competing at the national level. In 2003, the International Olympic Committee announced BMX would be a competing Olympic sport as of 2008, hoping to bring in the interest of younger viewers. Incidentally, rugby and golf will be Olympic competing sports as of 20(Mou had better start practicing now, George).





In 2008, Conner watched the Olympics and it was then he decided he would work to compete in 2012. He talked about his sacrifices, which included training instead of fun, while in high school. In 2010, he made the national levels, and was eligible to compete in the World Cup at age 17, when he won his first Junior Elite World Cup competition. He won two World Cup titles in 2011 and four in 2012. To earn his spot on the U.S. Olympic Team where only three men can compete, he had to win his trials, which he did in early summer 2012. He has trained

in Australia for three months, and notably, spent much training time in Chula Vista, California.

Conner discussed his experiences at the 2012 Olympics where he won all quarter trials, and ultimately, placed 7th in the main race. He indicated he was not just there for the Olympic experience, and was considered a "medal or bust" athlete. He met many athletics including the gymnastic "Fierce 5" and the fastest man in the world, Usain Bolt. There is no question Conner will work to make the 2016 U.S. Olympic Team and win a gold medal.

Next on the agenda was the raffle, and Conner was asked to pick the winning ticket -- **David L. David L.** was the lucky winner who drew an "8" from the remaining deck of cards, winning **\$8.** Conner was asked to lead our group in reciting the **Four Way Test** of the **Things We Think, Say and Do.** Of course, the meeting ended as it began -- with the clang of the bell.
