Her puzzle development starts with the size of the puzzle, whether or not a picture is included, and then "one across, one down." Gail noted it is difficult to work on several different puzzles at once. Gail's program was one of the more unique for the year. Prior to adjournment, Gail drew the winning raffle ticket, and Dave J. was the lucky one. He had the chance to win \$787; however, he didn't disappoint the rest of us when he won \$10.
