Program: Saving Smiles...Changing Lives Our Rotaplast Mission to India

A Rotary Mission Providing Cleft Lip and Palate Surgery

Each year thousands of children are born with cleft lip and palette anomalies. In many developing areas of the

world treatment is not available. Untreated, these children are ridiculed, rejected from society, and often deprived of an education. They are prone to serious upper respiratory problems, hearing loss, speech and dental problems. Rotaplast works locally with Rotarians to educate families and communities to provide free operations and therapeutic follow-up care for the patients.

On Thursday, October 16, 2014, former District Governor (2010-11) Roger and his wife Paulette will share their experiences as non-medical volunteers in Delhi, India with Rotaplast, International. They will detail how 90 minutes changed the life of a child with a cleft lip and palate and her family forever.

Bio

Serving on a medical mission to New Delhi, India, Roger and Paulette Schulte personally witnessed the humanitarian results of Rotaplast, a nonprofit organization through which Rotarians and volunteers provide reconstructive surgeries and treatments to children with cleft lips, cleft palates and related anomalies.

Roger is a native Californian, who grew up in Northern California. He holds an undergraduate degree from the University of California at Davis and an MA in education from Stanford University. Before retiring in 2006, his career spanned 40 years in California public education, first as an English/drama teacher and then as a school administrator. His favorite assignment was a 20 year gig as a junior high school principal in the Upland Unified School District.

On November 2007, Roger met Paulette while on an Upland Chamber of Commerce trip to China. Wonderful things in life happened. During his year as district governor they were married on December 18, 2010, and honeymooned in Paris over Christmas. Paulette is a retired director for the Cardio-vascular Research Institute at the University of California San Francisco

Roger joined Rotary in 1978. He was president of the Rotary Club of Upland in 1984-85 and served as District 5300's governor in 2010-11. He is most proud of initiating and being the first chairman of three major district youth leadership training programs: RYLA, the Interact Symposium, and the Teen Leadership

He and his wife have delivered wheelchairs in Hermosillo, Mexico, and annually participate in the District's SuperBuild outside of Tecate, Mexico.
