Long time member Dave J announced the start of "Fill the Truck and Spread the Word." The previous week's speaker, Laurie Hartig, moved Dave. He will be coordinating the Club's collecting of books for Spread the Word Nevada during the coming weeks. Children's books are used to build literacy, and adult books will be sold to raise money for the project. Dave urged members to bring donated books to the upcoming meetings.

Dave told the membership about approaching the Board last week, seeking support for a "hard luck" Vietnam Marine Vet who has had 10 surgeries following a gunshot to the stomach. Unable to continue his security job, the Vet is largely isolated in his Henderson apartment where he spends hours each day reading his Bible. His lamps and furniture are inadequate, and with the Board's blessing,

Dave passed the hat. Happily, the Club contributed nearly \$200. The Board is considering the starting of a future Veteran aid program.

Past Pres Mike Peterson's first trivia question was, "name the year in which Babe Ruth hit his 700th home run. Darcy Dougherty exempted herself from fines by answering correctly that the big homer happened in 1936. After a plethora of guesses, we learned the first color TV broadcast was horse racing on CBS.

Mike P. conducted Happy/Dammit Dollars hearing happiness from Pres Jack that his children are starting pre-school. Duane Frizell contributed a happy dollar for his trip for a family reunion (with his seven children) to Navoo, IL. Susan J was happy about completing a half marathon. Dave J was happy that his daughter Margaret is entering the army. Darcy D. happily announced that family is coming to help her celebrate her 60th birthday.



Program Chair Shelia C introduced our program speaker, long time friend of our club, member of the Fremont Club, and Assistant District Governor Linda Bertuzzi. Linda has assisted in the administration of polio inoculations in India. She has also participated in the Corazon Super build. Linda urged our members to go to the Super Build. In order to

qualify, the new homeowner must perform 3000 hours of community service. The three room homes are erected in one day by Rotarians from all over District 5300.

Rotary's polio eradication effort began in the mid '80s, when there were approximately 1000 worldwide cases diagnosed each day. Now only 150 cases are expected for the entire year, and polio is gone from every country except Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria. Linda said the eradication is nearly complete, but that the last one percent is the hardest to overcome. The inoculation involves two drops on the tongue of a child, at a cost of about 70 cents each. Last year was India's first with no new cases.

"This was the first time that I didn't see deformed people and beggars walking on all fours through the city streets. Hieroglyphics portrayed polio victims 3000 years ago." Linda said that clean fresh water is the key to good health, and she showed slides of the dams she helped construct. It was partially funded by RCGV. Inoculations are still being given in Asia and Africa.

Following her Polio Plus update, Linda drew the day's raffle ticket belonging to Shelia C. Shelia drew a two, leaving the joker and about \$700 for a future drawing. The meeting closed with Shelia leading the Club in the reciting of the Four Way Test.
